## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 17A of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 control of HIV, so as to establish a pilot program to provide preexposure prophylaxis drug
- 3 assistance or services to persons at risk of being infected with HIV; to provide for
- 4 requirements; to provide for implementation of the pilot program; to provide for a written
- 5 report; to provide for related matters; to provide for a contingent effective date; to repeal
- 6 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 17A of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to control of
- 10 HIV, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 11 "<u>31-17A-4.</u>

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- 12 (a) The department shall conduct a three-year pilot program for the purpose of providing
- preexposure prophylaxis drug assistance or services to persons who have tested negative
- 14 for the HIV infection but who have risk factors that expose them to HIV. The pilot
- program shall be conducted in counties identified by the federal Centers for Disease
- 16 Control and Prevention as at risk of outbreaks of HIV as a result of a high rate of opioid
- 17 related use or in such other counties as determined by the department. In designing the
- pilot program, the department may obtain advisement and consultation from county health
- departments in counties in this state that have an existing preexposure prophylaxis drug
- 20 <u>assistance program or related services.</u>
- 21 (b) The pilot program shall provide assistance for preexposure prophylaxis medications
- 22 approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration and for medical, laboratory, and
- 23 <u>outreach costs incurred in treatment. The department shall establish benchmark data at the</u>
- 24 <u>beginning of the pilot program which shall be compared to data at the end of such pilot</u>
- 25 <u>program to measure the effectiveness of such program. Participants in the pilot program</u>
- 26 <u>shall be subject to clinical guidelines established by the department consistent with</u>

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27 guidance from the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, which may in	include
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- 28 <u>but not be limited to, regular HIV testing, education information, sexually transmitted</u>
- 29 <u>infection testing, and supportive services</u>. Education information may be provided in
- writing, orally, or both.
- 31 (c) The department shall be authorized to solicit and accept grants of funding or in-kind
- 32 <u>services for use in conducting the pilot program.</u>
- 33 (d) The department is authorized to establish such rules and regulations as may be
- 34 <u>necessary to implement the pilot program.</u>
- 35 (e) No later than December 31, 2022, the department shall submit a detailed written report
- 36 on the implementation and effectiveness of the pilot program to the Governor, the Speaker
- of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate, and the chairpersons of the
- 38 House Committee on Health and Human Services and the Senate Health and Human
- 39 Services Committee. Such report shall also include recommendations as to expansion of
- 40 <u>the pilot program state-wide."</u>
- 41 SECTION 2.
- 42 This Act shall become effective only upon the effective date of a specific appropriation of
- 43 funds for purposes of this Act, as expressed in a line item making specific reference to such
- 44 Act in a General Appropriations Act enacted by the General Assembly.
- 45 SECTION 3.
- 46 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
