27 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That all employees who are 28 transferred to the State Library Agency and the State Library Board as a result of this Act 29 shall be transferred without diminution of their rights, benefits, employment, or retirement 30 status.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as expressly provided to the contrary in this Act, any transaction affected by or flowing from any statute added, amended, repealed, or transferred under this Act and validly entered into before the effective date of this Act, and every right, duty, or interest flowing from it remains valid after the effective date of this Act and may be terminated, completed, consummated, or enforced under the law.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as otherwise provided 1 $\mathbf{2}$ by law, all existing laws, regulations, proposed regulations, standards and guidelines, 3 policies, orders and other directives, forms, plans, memberships, contracts, property, 4 investigations, administrative and judicial responsibilities, rights to sue and be sued, and $\mathbf{5}$ all other duties and responsibilities associated with the functions of the agencies and units 6 that are the subject of this Act prior to the effective date of this Act shall continue in effect 7under and, as appropriate, are legal and binding on the State Library Agency and the State 8 Library Board until completed, withdrawn, canceled, modified, or otherwise changed under 9 the law.

10 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Library Board shall 11 be the successor to the Maryland Advisory Council on Libraries and nothing in this Act 12 shall affect the terms of office of a member of the Maryland Advisory Council on Libraries 13 who is serving on the effective date of this Act. An individual who is a member of any such 14 entity on the effective date of this Act shall remain a member for the balance of the term to 15 which the member is appointed, unless the member sooner dies, resigns, or is removed 16 under appropriate provisions of law.

17 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publisher of the 18 Annotated Code of Maryland, in consultation with and subject to the approval of the 19 Department of Legislative Services, shall correct, with no further action required by the 20 General Assembly, cross-references and terminology rendered incorrect by this Act or by 21 any other Act of the General Assembly of 2017 that affects provisions enacted by this Act. 22 The publisher shall adequately describe any such correction in an editor's note following 23 the section affected.

SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason in a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or any other application of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are declared severable.

29 SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 30 July 1, 2017.
