### A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Public Schools – School Resource Officers – Prohibited Conduct

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a school administrator or official or a school safety 4 coordinator from directing a school resource officer to enforce certain  $\mathbf{5}$ discipline-related policies, rules, regulations, or procedures; prohibiting a school 6 resource officer from unilaterally enforcing certain discipline-related policies, rules, 7 regulations, or procedures; requiring a certain curriculum to include training in 8 conduct that is prohibited for school resource officers; and generally relating to 9 prohibited conduct of school administrators or officials, school safety coordinators, and school resource officers. 10
