A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 16-6-13 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 penalties for violating Code Sections 16-6-9 through 16-6-12, so as to increase the penalty
- 3 provisions relating to pimping and pandering; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 4 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Code Section 16-6-13 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to penalties for
- 8 violating Code Sections 16-6-9 through 16-6-12, is amended by revising subsection (a) and
- 9 paragraph (2) of subsection (b) as follows:
- 10 "(a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this Code section, a person
- 11 convicted of violating:

- 12 (1) Code Section 16-6-10 shall be punished as for a misdemeanor of a high and
- aggravated nature, and at the sole discretion of the judge, all but 24 hours of any term of
- imprisonment imposed may be suspended, stayed, or probated;
- 15 (2) Code Section 16-6-9 shall be punished as for a misdemeanor;
- 16 (3) Code Section 16-6-11 shall be punished as for a misdemeanor of a high and
- aggravated nature, and at the sole discretion of the judge, all but 24 hours of any term of
- imprisonment imposed may be suspended, stayed, or probated guilty of a felony and shall
- be punished by a term of imprisonment of not less than one nor more than ten years; or
- 20 (4) Code Section 16-6-12 shall be punished <u>for a first offense</u> as for a misdemeanor of
- a high and aggravated nature, and at the sole discretion of the judge, all but 24 hours of
- any term of imprisonment imposed may be suspended, stayed, or probated; provided,
- however, that upon a second or subsequent conviction for such offense, he or she shall
- 24 <u>be guilty of a felony and punished by imprisonment of not less than one nor more than</u>
- 25 ten years."

26 "(2) A person convicted of any of the offenses enumerated in Code Sections 16-6-10 through 16-6-12 when such offense involves the conduct of a person under the age of 16 years shall be guilty of a felony and shall be punished by imprisonment for a period of not less than ten nor more than 30 years; and a fine of not more than \$100,000.00, or both."
