A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 13 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to organization of schools and school systems under the "Quality Basic
- 3 Education Act," so as to provide that a military student may attend any school in the local
- 4 school system; to provide a definition; to provide for a streamlined process and annual
- 5 notice; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 8 Part 13 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 9 relating to organization of schools and school systems under the "Quality Basic Education
- 10 Act," is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 11 "<u>20-2-295.</u>
- 12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'military student' means a school aged child of
- a military service member who lives on a military base or off-base in military housing.
- 14 (b) Beginning in school year 2017-2018, a military student in this state shall be allowed
- to attend any public school that is located within the school system in which the military
- base or off-base military housing in which the student resides is located, provided space
- is available for additional enrollment. The parent shall assume the responsibility for and
- 18 cost of transportation of the student to and from the school.
- 19 (c) Each local school system in which a military base or off-base military housing is
- 20 <u>located shall:</u>
- 21 (1) Establish a universal, streamlined process available to all students to implement the
- 22 <u>transfer requirements of this Code section; and</u>
- 23 (2) Annually notify prior to each school year the parents of each military student by
- 24 <u>letter, by electronic means, or by such other reasonable means in a timely manner of the</u>
- 25 <u>options available to the parent under this Code section."</u>
