Mr. LAWSON of Florida (for himself, Mr. RUTHERFORD, Mr. DIAZ-BALART, Mr. SOTO, Mr. DUNN, Mr. SPANO, Ms. CASTOR of Florida, Mr. YOHO, and Mr. WALTZ) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Natural Resources, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

- To designate the POW/MIA Memorial and Museum in Jacksonville, Florida, as the National POW/MIA Memorial and Museum, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National POW/MIA
- 5 Memorial and Museum Act of 2019".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds the following:

1 (1) The POW/MIA Memorial and Museum is a 2 civic landmark and cultural institution being built as 3 of the date of the enactment of this Act in Jackson-4 ville, Florida, to honor, connect, inspire, and educate 5 all people about the 142,000 members of the Armed 6 Forces who have been captured as prisoners of war 7 since World War II and the 82,000 members of the 8 Armed Forces who are currently missing in action or 9 unaccounted for since World War II. 10 (2) The POW/MIA Memorial and Museum is 11 the only public museum of its kind operating for the 12 exclusive purpose of honoring all former prisoners of 13 war, those who were missing in action, and those 14 who were unaccounted for. 15 (3) The POW/MIA Memorial and Museum will 16 share the stories of such individuals, showcase the 17 history of the POW/MIA logo, the history of the 18 Naval Air Station Cecil Field as a master jet base, 19 and will serve as a facility for the families of mem-20 bers of the Armed Forces.

(4) The POW/MIA Memorial and Museum will
attract and educate a diverse group of people
through visitor-centered, interactive, participatory
exhibits, and will provide a place for educational pro-

grams, special events, and activities connecting all
 generations.

3 SEC. 3. NATIONAL POW/MIA MEMORIAL AND MUSEUM.

4 (a) DESIGNATION.—The memorial and museum that
5 is, as of the date of the enactment of this Act, being con6 structed on an approximately 26-acre area on POW-MIA
7 Memorial Parkway, Jacksonville, Florida, shall be des8 ignated as the "National POW/MIA Memorial and Mu9 seum".

(b) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 90 days
after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Director
of the National POW/MIA Memorial and Museum shall
submit to Congress a report including—

(1) a budget for the POW/MIA Memorial and
Museum for the five-year period beginning on the
date the POW/MIA Memorial and Museum is expected to open to the public;

18 (2) a description of the organizational structure19 of the POW/MIA Memorial and Museum;

20 (3) a copy of any bylaws or rules implemented
21 by the POW/MIA Memorial and Museum; and

(4) a list of any organization or entity that hasaccredited the POW/MIA Memorial and Museum.

24 (c) WITHDRAWAL OF DESIGNATION.—The designa25 tion under subsection (a) may be withdrawn if—

(1) the POW/MIA Memorial and Museum is
 not operational in a satisfactory manner on the date
 that is five years after the date of the enactment of
 this Act; or

5 (2) the report under subsection (b) is submitted
6 to Congress after the date that is 90 days after the
7 date of the enactment of this Act.
