A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to conduct outreach to veterans regarding the effect of delayed payments of claims for emergency medical care furnished by non-Department of Veterans Affairs medical providers by the Office of Community Care and to direct the Secretary to submit to Congress an annual report regarding such delayed payments.

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Veterans' Credit Pro-
- 3 tection Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. OUTREACH TO VETERANS REGARDING EFFECT OF
- 5 CERTAIN DELAYED PAYMENTS BY DEPART-
- 6 MENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS OFFICE OF
- 7 **COMMUNITY CARE.**
- 8 (a) Outreach.—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs
- 9 shall conduct outreach, including through national and
- 10 local veterans service organizations, to inform veterans of
- 11 how to resolve credit issues caused by delayed payment
- 12 of an eligible claim for emergency hospital care, emergency
- 13 medical services, or other emergency health care furnished
- 14 through a non-Department of Veterans Affairs provider.
- 15 (b) Annual Report.—
- 16 (1) In General.—During the five-year period
- following the date of the enactment of this Act, the
- 18 Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall annually submit
- to Congress a report on the effectiveness of the Of-
- fice of Community Care (or successor office) in pro-
- viding timely payment of proper invoices for emer-
- gency hospital care, emergency medical services, or
- other emergency health care furnished through non-
- Department of Veterans Affairs providers by the re-
- 25 quired payment date.
- 26 (2) Periods Covered.—

| 18 | affect, the credit of the veteran. |
| 19 | (B) The number of proper invoices sub- |
| 20 | mitted, listed in a table for each quarter and |
| 21 | fiscal year of each such period that includes— |
| 22 | (i) the total amount owed by the Sec- |
| 23 | retary under the proper invoices; |
| 24 | (ii) the payment status of each proper |
| 25 | invoice, as of the date of the report; and |

| (iii) the period that elapsed until each |
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| proper invoice was paid, including an ex- |
| planation of any delayed payment. |
| (C) Any comments regarding delayed pay- |
| ments made by medical providers. |
| (D) A description of the best practices that |
| the Office of Community Care (or successor of- |
| fice) can carry out to provide timely payment of |
| a proper invoice, including a plan to improve |
| such timely payments. |
| (E) With respect to pending claims for re- |
| imbursement for emergency hospital care, emer- |
| gency medical services, and other emergency |
| health care furnished through non-Department |
| of Veterans Affairs providers— |
| (i) the total number of such pending |

| 25 | (c) Comptroller General Study.— |

- (1) In General.—The Comptroller General of the United States shall conduct a study that evalu-ates the effectiveness of the Office of Community Care in providing timely payment of a proper invoice for emergency hospital care, emergency medical serv-ices, or other emergency health care furnished through non-Department of Veterans Affairs pro-viders by the required payment date.
 - (2) Submittal.—The Comptroller General shall submit to Congress a report on the study conducted under paragraph (1), including the total amount of interest penalties paid by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs by reason of a delayed payment.

(d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

- (1) The term "delayed payment" means a proper invoice that is not paid by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs until after the required payment date.
- (2) The term "proper invoice" has the meaning given that term in section 3901(a) of title 31, United States Code.
- (3) The term "required payment date" means, with respect to proper invoices for emergency hospital care, emergency medical services, or other emergency health care, the date that payment is due

- 1 pursuant to standards determined appropriate by
- 2 the Secretary.

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
