# Public and Nonpublic Schools – Medical Cannabis – Policy for Administration During School Hours and Events (Connor and Raina's Law)

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "caregiver" to include, for an individual who 6 is a qualifying patient for the use of medical cannabis and under the age of 18 years, 7an adult a certain number of additional adults designated by the parent or legal 8 guardian of the qualifying patient; specifying that the definition of "caregiver" does 9 not include certain designated school personnel; altering specifying the number of 10 caregivers a certain qualifying patient may have; authorizing a qualifying patient 11 under the age of 18 years to obtain medical cannabis from certain designated school personnel: repealing a limitation on the number of qualifying patients that a certain 12caregiver may serve for a certain purpose exempting certain caregivers and 13 14 designated school personnel from civil and criminal penalties relating to the administration of medical cannabis, subject to a certain exception; authorizing 15caregivers of certain students who are qualifying medical cannabis patients to 16 17administer medical cannabis to a student on school property, during 18 school-sponsored activities, and on school buses; requiring, on or before a certain 19 date, the State Department of Education and the Natalie M.
