A BILL

To require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint a coin in commemoration of the opening of the National Law Enforcement Museum in the District of Columbia, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "National Law Enforce-
3	ment Museum Commemorative Coin Act".
4	SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
5	The Congress finds the following:
6	(1) In 2000, Congress passed and President
7	William J. Clinton signed into law the National Law
8	Enforcement Museum Act (Public Law 106–492),
9	which authorized the National Law Enforcement Of-
10	ficers Memorial Fund, Inc. to build the National
11	Law Enforcement Museum on Federal land in the
12	District of Columbia to honor and commemorate the
13	service and sacrifice of law enforcement officers in
14	the United States.
15	(2) In April 2016, construction began on the
16	National Law Enforcement Museum in the District
17	of Columbia across the street from the National Law
18	Enforcement Officers Memorial in Judiciary Square.
19	(3) The National Law Enforcement Museum
20	formally opened on October 13, 2018.
21	(4) The National Law Enforcement Museum's
22	mission is—
23	(A) to honor and commemorate the ex-
24	traordinary service and sacrifice of America's
25	law enforcement officers;

1	(B) to serve as an important bridge be-
2	tween law enforcement's past and present, be-
3	tween the heroes of yesteryear and those who
4	have followed in their footsteps, and between
5	America's peace officers and the public they
6	serve; and
7	(C) increase public understanding and sup-
8	port for law enforcement and to promote law
9	enforcement safety.
10	SEC. 3. COIN SPECIFICATIONS.
11	(a) Denominations.—The Secretary of the Treas-
12	ury (hereafter in this Act referred to as the "Secretary")
13	shall mint and issue the following coins:
14	(1) \$5 GOLD COINS.—Not more than $50,000$ \$5
15	coins, which shall—
16	(A) weigh 8.359 grams;
17	(B) have a diameter of 0.850 inches; and
18	(C) contain not less than 90 percent gold.
19	(2) \$1 SILVER COINS.—Not more than 400,000
20	\$1 coins, which shall—
21	(A) weigh 26.73 grams;
22	(B) have a diameter of 1.500 inches; and
23	(C) contain not less than 90 percent silver.
24	(3) Half-dollar clad coins.—Not more
25	than 750,000 half-dollar coins which shall—

1	(A) weigh 11.34 grams;
2	(B) have a diameter of 1.205 inches; and
3	(C) be minted to the specifications for half-
4	dollar coins contained in section 5112(b) of title
5	31, United States Code.
6	(b) Legal Tender.—The coins minted under this
7	Act shall be legal tender, as provided in section 5103 of
8	title 31, United States Code.
9	(c) Numismatic Items.—For purposes of section
10	5134 of title 31, United States Code, all coins minted
11	under this Act shall be considered to be numismatic items.
12	SEC. 4. DESIGN OF COINS.
13	(a) Design Requirements.—
14	(1) In general.—The design of the coins
15	minted under this Act shall be emblematic of the
16	National Law Enforcement Museum and the service
17	and sacrifice of law enforcement officers throughout
18	the history of the United States.
19	(2) Designation and inscriptions.—On
20	each coin minted under this Act there shall be—
21	(A) a designation of the value of the coin;
22	(B) an inscription of the year "2021"; and
23	(C) inscriptions of the words "Liberty",
24	"In God We Trust", "United States of Amer-
25	ica", and "E Pluribus Unum".

1	(b) Selection.—The design for the coins minted
2	under this Act shall be—
3	(1) selected by the Secretary after consultation
4	with the Commission of Fine Arts and the National
5	Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc.; and
6	(2) reviewed by the Citizens Coinage Advisory
7	Committee.
8	SEC. 5. ISSUANCE OF COINS.
9	(a) QUALITY OF COINS.—Coins minted under this
10	Act shall be issued in uncirculated and proof qualities.
11	(b) MINT FACILITIES.—Only 1 facility of the United
12	States Mint may be used to strike any particular quality
13	of the coins minted under this Act.
14	(c) Period for Issuance.—The Secretary may
15	issue coins minted under this Act only during the 1-year
16	period beginning on January 1, 2021.
17	SEC. 6. SALE OF COINS.
18	(a) Sale Price.—The coins issued under this Act
19	shall be sold by the Secretary at a price equal to the sum
20	of—
21	(1) the face value of the coins;
22	(2) the surcharge provided in section 7(a) with
23	respect to such coins; and

1 (3) the cost of designing and issuing the coins 2 (including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery, 3 overhead expenses, marketing, and shipping). 4 (b) Bulk Sales.—The Secretary shall make bulk 5 sales of the coins issued under this Act at a reasonable 6 discount. 7 (c) Prepaid Orders.— 8 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall accept 9 prepaid orders for the coins minted under this Act 10 before the issuance of such coins. 11 (2) DISCOUNT.—Sale prices with respect to pre-12 paid orders under paragraph (1) shall be at a rea-13 sonable discount. 14 SEC. 7. SURCHARGES. 15 (a) IN GENERAL.—All sales of coins issued under this Act shall include a surcharge of— 16 17 (1) \$35 per coin for the \$5 coin; 18 (2) \$10 per coin for the \$1 coin; and 19 (3) \$5 per coin for the half-dollar coin. 20 (b) DISTRIBUTION.—Subject to section 5134(f)(1) of 21 title 31, United States Code, all surcharges received by the Secretary from the sale of coins issued under this Act 23 shall be promptly paid by the Secretary to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, Inc., for educational and outreach programs and exhibits.

- 1 (c) Audits.—The National Law Enforcement Offi-
- 2 cers Memorial Fund, Inc., shall be subject to the audit
- 3 requirements of section 5134(f)(2) of title 31, United
- 4 States Code, with regard to the amounts received under
- 5 subsection (b).
- 6 (d) Limitation.—Notwithstanding subsection (a),
- 7 no surcharge may be included with respect to the issuance
- 8 under this Act of any coin during a calendar year if, as
- 9 of the time of such issuance, the issuance of such coin
- 10 would result in the number of commemorative coin pro-
- 11 grams issued during such year to exceed the annual 2
- 12 commemorative coin program issuance limitation under
- 13 section 5112(m)(1) of title 31, United States Code (as in
- 14 effect on the date of the enactment of this Act). The Sec-
- 15 retary of the Treasury may issue guidance to carry out
- 16 this subsection.

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
