A BILL

To amend part D of title IV of the Social Security Act to allow States to use incentive payments available under the child support enforcement program to improve parent-child relationships, increase child support collections, and improve outcomes for children by supporting parenting time arrangements for noncustodial parents in uncontested agreements, and for other purposes.

1 **SECTION 1. EXPANDING PERMITTED USES OF INCENTIVE**
 2 **PAYMENTS.**

3 Section 458 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.
 4 658a) is amended—

5 (1) in subsection (f)—

6 (A) in paragraph (1), by striking “; or”
 7 and inserting a semicolon;

8 (B) by redesignating paragraph (2) as
 9 paragraph (3); and

10 (C) by inserting after paragraph (1) the
 11 following new paragraph:

12 “(2) to develop, implement, and evaluate proce-
 13 dures for establishing a parenting time arrangement
 14 when establishing an initial or modified child sup-
 15 port order or a medical support order (including pro-
 16 cedures for carrying out a parenting time arrange-
 17 ment made prior to the establishment or modifica-
 18 tion of any such order); or”; and

19 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
 20 section:

21 “(g) **DEFINITIONS OF PARENTING TIME ARRANGE-**
 22 **MENT AND NONCUSTODIAL PARENT.—**

23 “(1) **PARENTING TIME ARRANGEMENT.—**For
 24 purposes of subsection (f)(2), the term ‘parenting
 25 time arrangement’ means an arrangement governing
 26 how much time a child spends with the child’s custo-

1 dial parent and the child's noncustodial parent that
2 is mutually agreed to by the parents and is not con-
3 tested by either parent in any forum.

4 “(2) NONCUSTODIAL PARENT.—For purposes
5 of paragraph (1), the term ‘noncustodial parent’
6 means the parent of a child that the child does not
7 live with for the majority of the child's time.”.
