- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 (a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Governor 17 shall provide sufficient funds in the budget to:

- (i) ensure that the value of temporary cash assistance, combinedwith federal food stamps, is equal to at least:
- 201.FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021, 61% of the State minimum21living level; [and]
