4 This Act may be cited as the "Artistic Recognition

5 for Talented Students Act" or the "ARTS Act".

3 Section 708 of title 17, United States Code, is4 amended by adding at the end the following:

5 "(e)(1) In this subsection, the term 'covered competi-6 tion' means—

7 "(A) an art competition sponsored by the Con8 gressional Institute that is open only to high school
9 students; or

"(B) the competition established under section
3 of House Resolution 77, 113th Congress, agreed
to February 26, 2013.

13 "(2) With respect to a work that wins a covered com-14 petition, the Register of Copyrights—

15 "(A) shall waive the requirement under sub-16 section (a)(1) with respect to an application for reg-17 istration of a copyright claim for that work if that 18 application is submitted to the Copyright Office not 19 later than the last day of the calendar year following 20 the year in which the work claimed by the applica-21 tion wins the covered competition (referred to in this 22 paragraph as the 'covered year'); and

"(B) may waive a fee described in subparagraph (A) for an application submitted after the end
of the covered year if the fee would have been
waived under that subparagraph had the application

been submitted before the last day of the covered year.".
