1 AN ACT concerning

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Public Schools – Provision of Menstrual Hygiene Products

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education to ensure that each public school provide, at no charge to students, menstrual hygiene products via dispensers 4 $\mathbf{5}$ in the restrooms at the school; requiring a <u>public middle or high</u> school to install 6 menstrual hygiene product dispensers in a certain number of certain restrooms by 7 certain dates; requiring a public elementary school to install menstrual hygiene product dispensers in at least one restroom by a certain date; defining a certain term; 8 and generally relating to the provision of menstrual hygiene products in public 9 10 schools.

3 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "MENSTRUAL HYGIENE PRODUCTS" MEANS 4 SIZE-APPROPRIATE TAMPONS OR SANITARY NAPKINS FOR USE IN CONNECTION 5 WITH THE MENSTRUAL CYCLE.

6 (B) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, EACH COUNTY BOARD 7 SHALL ENSURE THAT EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL PROVIDE, AT NO CHARGE TO STUDENTS, 8 MENSTRUAL HYGIENE PRODUCTS VIA DISPENSERS IN THE RESTROOMS AT THE 9 SCHOOL.

10 (C) (1) A PUBLIC <u>MIDDLE OR HIGH</u> SCHOOL SHALL INSTALL MENSTRUAL 11 HYGIENE PRODUCT DISPENSERS IN:

- 12(1)(1)AT LEAST TWO RESTROOMS ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1,132020; AND
- 14 (2) (II) ALL RESTROOMS ON ON BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2024:
- 15 <u>**1.**</u> IF THE RESTROOMS ARE DIVIDED BY GENDER:</u>
- 16 <u>A.</u> <u>AT LEAST ONE MEN'S RESTROOM; AND</u>
- 17 <u>B.</u> <u>ALL WOMEN'S RESTROOMS; OR</u>
- 182.IF THE RESTROOMS ARE NOT DIVIDED BY GENDER,19ALL RESTROOMS.

20 (2) <u>A PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL SHALL INSTALL MENSTRUAL</u> 21 <u>HYGIENE PRODUCT DISPENSERS IN AT LEAST ONE RESTROOM ON OR BEFORE</u> 22 OCTOBER 1, 2020.
