A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

| 1 To amend Chapter 4 of Title 26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating |
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- 2 pharmacists and pharmacies, so as to provide for the licensure of durable medical equipment
- 3 suppliers; to provide for a definition; to provide for requirements for licensure; to provide for
- 4 discipline and revocation; to provide for inspections; to provide for exemptions; to provide
- 5 for rules and regulations; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
- 6 other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

| 8 | SECTION 1. |
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| 9 | Chapter 4 of Title 26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to pharmacists and |
| 10 | pharmacies, is amended in Code Section 26-4-5, relating to definitions, by adding a new |
| 11 | paragraph to read as follows: |
| 12 | "(14.05) 'Durable medical equipment' means equipment for which a prescription is |
| 13 | required, including repair and replacement parts for such equipment, and which: |
| 14 | (A) Can withstand repeated use; |
| 15 | (B) Has an expected life of at least three years; |
| 16 | (C) Is primarily and customarily used to serve a medical purpose; |
| 17 | (D) Generally is not useful to a person in the absence of illness or injury; and |
| 18 | (E) Is appropriate for use in the home." |

19 **SECTION 2.**

- 20 Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 26-4-28, relating to the powers, duties, and
- 21 authority of the Georgia State Board of Pharmacy, by adding a new paragraph to subsection
- 22 (a) to read as follows:
- 23 "(14.1) The issuance, suspension, denial, and renewal of licenses for suppliers of durable
- 24 <u>medical equipment pursuant to Code Section 26-4-51;</u>"

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25 SECTION 3.

- 26 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 27 "<u>26-4-51.</u>
- 28 (a) Any person who sells or rents durable medical equipment to a consumer, either directly
- 29 <u>or through a contractual arrangement, shall possess a durable medical equipment supplier</u>
- 30 <u>license issued by the board pursuant to this Code section.</u>
- 31 (b) The board shall be authorized to issue a license to an applicant for licensure as a
- 32 <u>durable medical equipment supplier if the applicant:</u>
- 33 (1) Submits an application in the form prescribed by the board;
- 34 (2) Maintains an office or place of business within this state;
- 35 (3) Pays the license fee established by the board pursuant to paragraph (37) of
- 36 <u>subsection (a) of Code Section 26-4-28; and</u>
- 37 (4) Meets all safety standards and requirements established by the board, including but
- 38 <u>not limited to the establishment of written procedures for:</u>
- 39 (A) Ensuring that all personnel engaged in delivery, maintenance, and repair of durable
- 40 <u>medical equipment receives annual continuing education;</u>
- 41 (B) Instructing the patient or patient's caregiver on how to use the durable medical
- 42 <u>equipment provided;</u>
- 43 (C) Receiving and responding to complaints from patients;
- 44 (D) Maintaining records of all patients receiving durable medical equipment; and
- 45 (E) Management, maintenance, and servicing of durable medical equipment.
- 46 (c) Licenses issued pursuant to this Code section shall be effective for 36 months from the
- 47 <u>date of issuance and shall not be transferable or assignable.</u>
- 48 (d) The board may refuse to issue or renew, or may suspend, revoke, or restrict the licenses
- of, or fine any person pursuant to the procedures set forth in Code Section 26-4-60 for any
- of the grounds set forth in subsection (a) of such Code section or upon a finding that the
- 51 <u>applicant or licensee:</u>
- 52 (1) Has violated any state or federal law or regulation related to the provision of durable
- 53 <u>medical equipment; or</u>
- 54 (2) Fails to meet the safety standards established by the board.
- (e) The board reserves the right to initially and periodically inspect the applicant's or
- 56 <u>licensee's office or place of business within this state.</u> Such applicant or licensee shall be
- 57 required to pay a reasonable and adequate fee established by the board pursuant to
- 58 paragraph (37) of subsection (a) of Code Section 26-4-28 to cover the cost of such
- 59 <u>inspections.</u>

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60 (f) The following persons and entities shall be exempt from the requirements of this Code

- 61 <u>section unless any such person or entity has a separate company, corporation, or division</u>
- 62 that is in the business of selling or renting durable medical equipment to consumers:
- 63 (1) Pharmacies and pharmacists;
- 64 <u>(2) Hospitals;</u>
- 65 (3) Ambulatory surgical centers:
- 66 (4) Health care facilities owned or operated by the state or federal government;
- 67 (5) Skilled nursing facilities;
- 68 (6) Assisted living facilities;
- 69 (7) Health care practitioners who:
- 70 (A) Provide durable medical equipment within the scope of practice of the health care
- 71 <u>practitioner's profession; and</u>
- 72 (B) Are licensed in this state to practice the health care practitioner's profession;
- 73 (8) Suppliers of insulin infusion pumps and related supplies or services; and
- 74 (9) Manufacturers or wholesale distributors that do not provide durable medical
- 75 <u>equipment directly to consumers.</u>
- 76 (g) The board shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to implement the
- 77 provisions of this Code section. Such rules and regulations shall be established with the
- 78 <u>intent of ensuring patient safety and quality of durable medical equipment. The board may</u>
- 79 provide by rules and regulations that any person accredited by organizations recognized by
- 80 <u>the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services is deemed to meet all or some of</u>
- 81 <u>the requirements of this Code section.</u> Further, the board shall be authorized to require the
- 82 <u>completion of background checks, including, but not limited to, criminal history record</u>
- checks, on any applicants or licensees, on any persons who will have direct contact with
- patients, and on any other licensee personnel deemed necessary for purposes of patient
- 85 <u>safety."</u>

SECTION 4.

87 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
