The House Committee on Health and Human Services offers the following substitute to SB 41:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1	To amend Chapter 4	of Title 26 of the	Official Code of	Georgia Annotated,	relating to

- 2 pharmacists and pharmacies, so as to provide for the licensure of durable medical equipment
- 3 suppliers; to provide for a definition; to provide for requirements for licensure; to provide for
- 4 discipline and revocation; to provide for inspections; to provide for exemptions; to provide
- 5 for rules and regulations; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
- 6 other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 4 of Title 26 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to pharmacists and
- 10 pharmacies, is amended in Code Section 26-4-5, relating to definitions, by adding a new
- 11 paragraph to read as follows:
- 12 "(14.05) 'Durable medical equipment' means equipment for which a prescription is
- required, including repair and replacement parts for such equipment, and which:
- 14 (A) Can withstand repeated use;
- 15 (B) Has an expected life of at least three years;
- (C) Is primarily and customarily used to serve a medical purpose;
- 17 (D) Generally is not useful to a person in the absence of illness or injury; and
- (E) Is appropriate for use in the home."
- 19 SECTION 2.
- 20 Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 26-4-28, relating to the powers, duties, and
- 21 authority of the Georgia State Board of Pharmacy, by adding a new paragraph to subsection
- 22 (a) to read as follows:
- 23 "(14.1) The issuance, suspension, denial, and renewal of licenses for suppliers of durable
- 24 <u>medical equipment pursuant to Code Section 26-4-51;</u>"

25 SECTION 3.

- 26 Said chapter is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 27 "<u>26-4-51.</u>
- 28 (a) Any person who supplies durable medical equipment to a consumer and submits a
- 29 <u>claim for reimbursement by a third party, either directly or through a contractual</u>
- 30 <u>arrangement, shall possess a durable medical equipment supplier license issued by the</u>
- 31 <u>board pursuant to this Code section.</u>
- 32 (b) The board shall be authorized to issue a license to an applicant for licensure as a
- 33 <u>durable medical equipment supplier if the applicant:</u>
- 34 (1) Submits an application in the form prescribed by the board;
- 35 (2) Maintains an office or place of business within this state;
- 36 (3) Pays the license fee established by the board pursuant to paragraph (37) of
- 37 subsection (a) of Code Section 26-4-28; and
- 38 (4) Meets all safety standards and requirements established by the board, including but
- 39 <u>not limited to the establishment of written procedures for:</u>
- 40 (A) Ensuring that all personnel engaged in delivery, maintenance, and repair of durable
- 41 <u>medical equipment receives annual continuing education;</u>
- 42 (B) Instructing the patient or patient's caregiver on how to use the durable medical
- 43 equipment provided;
- 44 (C) Receiving and responding to complaints from patients;
- 45 (D) Maintaining records of all patients receiving durable medical equipment; and
- 46 (E) Management, maintenance, and servicing of durable medical equipment.
- 47 (c) The board may issue a license to a Medicare enrolled out-of-state manufacturer or
- 48 wholesale distributor that provides durable medical equipment directly to consumers if
- 49 <u>such manufacturer or wholesale distributor possesses a valid license from another state.</u>
- 50 Such manufacturer or wholesale distributor shall be exempt from the requirements of
- 51 paragraph (2) of subsection (b) of this Code section.
- 52 (d) Licenses issued pursuant to this Code section shall be effective for 36 months from the
- 53 <u>date of issuance and shall not be transferable or assignable.</u>
- 54 (e) The board may refuse to issue or renew, or may suspend, revoke, or restrict the licenses
- of, or fine any person pursuant to the procedures set forth in Code Section 26-4-60 for any
- of the grounds set forth in subsection (a) of such Code section or upon a finding that the
- 57 <u>applicant or licensee:</u>
- 58 (1) Has violated any state or federal law or regulation related to the provision of durable
- 59 <u>medical equipment; or</u>
- 60 (2) Fails to meet the safety standards established by the board.

61 (f) The board reserves the right to initially and periodically inspect the applicant's or

- 62 <u>licensee's office or place of business within this state.</u> Such applicant or licensee shall be
- 63 required to pay a reasonable and adequate fee established by the board pursuant to
- 64 paragraph (37) of subsection (a) of Code Section 26-4-28 to cover the cost of such
- 65 <u>inspections.</u>
- 66 (g) The following persons and entities shall be exempt from the requirements of this Code
- 67 <u>section unless any such person or entity has a separate company, corporation, or division</u>
- 68 that is in the business of supplying durable medical equipment to consumers and submits
- 69 <u>a claim for reimbursement by a third party:</u>
- 70 (1) Pharmacies and pharmacists;
- 71 <u>(2) Hospitals;</u>
- 72 (3) Ambulatory surgical centers;
- 73 (4) Health care facilities owned or operated by the state or federal government;
- 74 (5) Skilled nursing facilities;
- 75 (6) Assisted living facilities;
- 76 (7) Health care practitioners who:
- 77 (A) Provide durable medical equipment within the scope of practice of the health care
- 78 <u>practitioner's profession; and</u>
- 79 (B) Are licensed in this state to practice the health care practitioner's profession;
- 80 (8) Suppliers of insulin infusion pumps and related supplies or services;
- 81 (9) Manufacturers or wholesale distributors that do not sell or rent durable medical
- 82 <u>equipment directly to consumers;</u>
- 83 (10) Renal dialysis providers licensed under Code Section 31-44-4 and persons or
- 84 <u>entities that distribute devices necessary to perform home renal dialysis to patients with</u>
- 85 <u>chronic kidney disease; and</u>
- 86 (11) Suppliers of osteogenesis stimulators, transcutaneous electrical nerve stimulators,
- 87 <u>pneumatic compression devices, and related supplies or services.</u>
- 88 (h) The board shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to implement the
- 89 provisions of this Code section. Such rules and regulations shall be established with the
- 90 <u>intent of ensuring patient safety and quality of durable medical equipment. The board may</u>
- 91 provide by rules and regulations that any person accredited by organizations recognized by
- 92 <u>the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services is deemed to meet all or some of</u>
- 93 the requirements of this Code section. Further, the board shall be authorized to require the
- 94 completion of background checks, including, but not limited to, criminal history record
- checks, on any applicants or licensees, on any persons who will have direct contact with
- patients, and on any other licensee personnel deemed necessary for purposes of patient
- 97 <u>safety.</u>

98 (i) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to restrict or prohibit the ability of a 99 person or business to engage in a private transaction between two parties."

101 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
