A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary of Homeland Security from implementing or enforcing a remain in Texas policy.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON SECRETARY OF HOMELAND SECURITY FROM IMPLEMENTING OR EN FORCING A REMAIN IN TEXAS POLICY.

4 (a) PROHIBITION.—No Federal funds may be used
5 by the Secretary of Homeland Security to implement or
6 enforce a remain in Texas policy.

7 (b) REMAIN IN TEXAS POLICY DEFINED.—In this 8 section, the term "remain in Texas policy" means a policy 9 that requires any alien to remain in the State of Texas 10 after such alien is released or paroled by the Secretary 11 of Homeland Security or the Secretary of Health and 12 Human Services into the United States.
