## A BILL

To extend the State Opioid Response Grants program, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "State Opioid Response
- 5 Grant Authorization Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. EXTENDING STATE OPIOID RESPONSE GRANTS
- 7 **PROGRAM.**
- 8 (a) In General.—For each of fiscal years 2020
- 9 through 2024, the Secretary shall continue to award the
- 10 State Opioid Response Grants funded by the heading

- 1 "Substance Abuse And Mental Health Services Adminis-
- 2 tration—Substance Abuse Treatment" in title II of the
- 3 Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and
- 4 Education, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act,
- 5 2018 (Public Law 115–141) in the same manner and sub-
- 6 ject to the same conditions as were applicable to such
- 7 grants for fiscal year 2018.

- 8 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—
- 9 (1) IN GENERAL.—To carry out this Act, there 10 is authorized to be appropriated \$1,000,000,000 for 11 each of fiscal years 2020 through 2024.
  - (2) RESERVATION OF FUNDS.—Of the amount made available under paragraph (1), not less than \$50,000,000 shall be reserved to make grants to Indian Tribes or tribal organizations.
