## A BILL

To extend the State Opioid Response Grants program, and  
for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “State Opioid Response  
5 Grant Authorization Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. EXTENDING STATE OPIOID RESPONSE GRANTS**  
7 **PROGRAM.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—For each of fiscal years 2020  
9 through 2024, the Secretary shall continue to award the  
10 State Opioid Response Grants funded by the heading

1 “Substance Abuse And Mental Health Services Adminis-  
2 tration—Substance Abuse Treatment” in title II of the  
3 Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and  
4 Education, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act,  
5 2018 (Public Law 115–141) in the same manner and sub-  
6 ject to the same conditions as were applicable to such  
7 grants for fiscal year 2018.

8 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—To carry out this Act, there  
10 is authorized to be appropriated \$1,000,000,000 for  
11 each of fiscal years 2020 through 2024.

12 (2) RESERVATION OF FUNDS.—Of the amount  
13 made available under paragraph (1), not less than  
14 \$50,000,000 shall be reserved to make grants to In-  
15 dian Tribes or tribal organizations.
