## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 4501.21 be amended and sections	6
4503.961, 4503.962, and 4503.963 of the Revised Code be enacted	7

Sec. 4501.21. (A) There is hereby created in the state	9
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	10
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants	11

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar collects in the fund as follows:

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or other abortion-related activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received
pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism
society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs
and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 76 receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to 77 special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions 78

for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.	79
The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar	80

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 205 contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 206 4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 207 source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 208 designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 209 Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 210 section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 211 cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 212 veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 213 pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 214 215 maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties.

include bereavement counseling, instruction in defensive driving	495

providing such services, the school may pay for members of the	499
faculty of the school to receive training in providing those	500
services. The school principal or, in the school principal's	501

services. The school shall ensure that any such charitable	504
organization is exempt from federal income taxation under	505

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily	1048
inscribed on the license plates, "Ross High School" license	1049
plates shall display an appropriate logo and words that are	1050
selected by representatives of Ross high school and approved by	1051
the registrar. "Ross High School" license plates shall display	1052
county identification stickers that identify the county of	1053
registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised	1054
Code.	1055
(B) "Ross High School" license plates and a validation	1056
sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon	1057
receipt of an application for registration of a motor vehicle	1058
under this section; payment of the regular license tax as	1059
prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any	1060
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504.	1061
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by	1062

(C)(1) For each application for registration and	1068
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this	1069
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of thirty	1070
dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into the	1071

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of	1074
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of	1075
