## A BILL

To require the development of a national strategy to secure schools against terrorism nationwide, and ensure domestic preparedness for and the response to terrorism, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Strategy for
- 5 School Security Act of 2024".

3	(a) In General.—To assist in the domestic pre-					
4	paredness for and response to acts of terrorism and t

8	(20 U.S.C. 7801)), not later than 180 days after the date					
9	of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland					
10	Security, in consultation and cooperation with the Sec-					
11	retary of Education and the heads of other appropriate					
12	Federal agencies and departments, shall develop and sub					
13	mit to the Committee on Homeland Security and the Com					
14	mittee on Education and the Workforce of the House o					
15	Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security					
16	and Governmental Affairs and the Committee on Health					
17	Education, Labor, and Pensions of the Senate a national					
18	school security strategy including, as appropriate, updates					
19	to such strategy.					
20	(b) Contents.—The strategy required under sub-					
21	section (a) shall—

23	projects, and activities, including spending levels, to					
24	secure elementary and secondary schools from acts

- (3) describe actions to be taken to achieve such goals and the means necessary to do so, including steps to reform, improve, and streamline existing efforts to align the current threat environment to schools; and
- 10 (4) identify new authorities or changes in exist-11 ing authorities required to address school security.
- 12 (c) SUNSET.—The requirement to transmit updated 13 national strategies under this section shall terminate on 14 the date that is seven years after the date of the enact-15 ment of this Act.

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
