4	FOR the purpose of requiring a license holder, before each renewal of a Class B or Class H
5	alcoholic beverages license in Anne Arundel County, to attest in a sworn statement
6	that the gross receipts from food sales for a certain period of time immediately
7	preceding the application for renewal were equal to at least a certain percentage of
8	the gross receipts from the sale of food and alcoholic beverages; and generally
9	relating to the renewal of Class B and Class H alcoholic beverages licenses in Anne
10	Arundel County.

21	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
$\overline{22}$	That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
23	Article – Alcoholic Beverages

25	This title applies only in Anne Arundel County.

- 3 (b) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer and light wine at a hotel 4 or restaurant, at retail, at the place described in the license, for on- and off-premises 5 consumption.
- 6 (c) BEFORE EACH RENEWAL OF THE LICENSE, THE LICENSE HOLDER SHALL
 7 ATTEST IN A SWORN STATEMENT THAT THE GROSS RECEIPTS FROM FOOD SALES FOR
 8 THE 12-MONTH PERIOD IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE APPLICATION FOR

- 14 (b) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer and light wine at a hotel or restaurant, at retail, at the place described in the license, for on-premises consumption.
- 16 (c) BEFORE EACH RENEWAL OF THE LICENSE, THE LICENSE HOLDER SHALL
 17 ATTEST IN A SWORN STATEMENT THAT THE GROSS RECEIPTS FROM FOOD SALES FOR
 18 THE 12-MONTH PERIOD IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE APPLICATION FOR

- 23 (a) There is a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license.
- 24 (b) The Board may issue the license for use by a restaurant that:
- 25 (1) has ample space and accommodations for regularly preparing, selling, 26 and serving hot meals to the public at least twice daily;
- 27 (2) is equipped with a public dining room with sufficient tables, chairs, 28 cutlery, and glassware to serve the meals prepared in the restaurant;
- 29 (3) is equipped with a kitchen that has complete facilities and utensils for 30 preparing and serving hot and cold meals to the public; and

- 1 (4) employs a sufficient number of cooks and wait staff to serve the number 2 of customers accommodated in the dining room.
- 3 (c) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at retail 4 at the place described in the license, for on— or off—premises consumption.
- 5 (d) Before each renewal of the license, the license holder shall 6 Attest in a sworn statement that the gross receipts from food sales for 7 the 12-month period immediately preceding the application for 8 Renewal were at least equal to 51% of the gross receipts from the sale 9 of food and alcoholic beverages.
- 10 **(E)** The annual fee for the license is \$1,080.
- 11 11-905.
- 12 (a) There is a Class H beer, wine, and liquor license.
- 13 (b) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at retail at the place described in the license, for on–premises consumption.
- 15 (c) The license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor during the hours and days 16 as set out under § 11–2004(e) of this title.
- 17 (d) BEFORE EACH RENEWAL OF THE LICENSE, THE LICENSE HOLDER SHALL
 18 ATTEST IN A SWORN STATEMENT THAT THE GROSS RECEIPTS FROM FOOD SALES FOR
 19 THE 12-MONTH PERIOD IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE APPLICATION FOR
 20 RENEWAL WERE AT LEAST EQUAL TO 51% OF THE GROSS RECEIPTS FROM THE SALE
 21 OF FOOD AND ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.
- 22 **(E)** The annual license fee is \$960.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
