FOR the purpose of prohibiting, on or after a certain date, the use of fire-fighting foam containing perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances for firefighter training purposes; establishing certain penalties for a violation of this Act; defining a certain term; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances.
