# A BILL

To amend the United States Semiquincentennial Commission Act of 2016 to modify certain membership and other requirements of the United States Semiquincentennial Commission, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "United States
- 5 Semiquincentennial Commission Amendments Act of
- 6 2020".

1	SEC. 2. UNITED STATES SEMIQUINCENTENNIAL COMMIS-
2	SION.
3	(a) Establishment of Commission.—Section 4 of
4	the United States Semiquincentennial Commission Act of
5	2016 (Public Law 114–196; 130 Stat. 685) is amended—
6	(1) in subsection (b)(4), by striking subpara-
7	graph (I) and inserting the following:
8	"(I) The Chairperson of the National En-
9	dowment for the Arts.
10	"(J) The Chairperson of the National En-
11	dowment for the Humanities.
12	"(K) The Director of the Institute of Mu-
13	seum and Library Services.
14	"(L)(i) The Chief Justice of the United
15	States; or
16	"(ii) an Associate Justice or former Asso-
17	ciate Justice appointed by the Chief Justice of
18	the United States.";
19	(2) in subsection (c), by adding at the end the
20	following:
21	"(3) Removal of members who are private
22	CITIZENS.—On an affirmative vote of not less than
23	<sup>2</sup> / <sub>3</sub> of the members of the Commission, the Commis-
24	sion may remove a member of the Commission ap-
25	pointed under subsection (b)(3)."; and
26	(3) in subsection (d)—

1	(A) by striking "All meetings" and insert-
2	ing the following:
3	"(1) Location of first meeting.—The first
4	meeting"; and
5	(B) by adding at the end the following:
6	"(2) Location of subsequent meetings.—
7	At least 1 meeting of the Commission each year
8	shall be held in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.".
9	(b) Duties.—Section 5(c)(1) of the United States
10	Semiquincentennial Commission Act of 2016 (Public Law
11	114–196; 130 Stat. 687) is amended by striking "2 years
12	after the date of enactment of this Act" and inserting
13	"March 31, 2020".
14	(c) Coordination.—Section 6(b) of the United
15	States Semiquincentennial Commission Act of 2016 (Pub-
16	lic Law 114–196; 130 Stat. 689) is amended—
17	(1) in paragraph (3)(A), by striking "presiding
18	officer of the Federal Council on the Arts and the
19	Humanities, the Chairperson of the National En-
20	dowment for the Arts, and the Chairperson of the
21	National Endowment for the Humanities" and in-
22	serting "Chairperson of the National Endowment for
23	the Arts, the Chairperson of the National Endow-
24	ment for the Humanities, and the Director of the
25	Institute of Museum and Library Services': and

1 (2) in paragraph (4), in the matter preceding 2 subparagraph (A), by inserting "and other" after 3 "founding". 4 (d) Expenditures of Commission.—Section 9 of the United States Semiquincentennial Commission Act of 6 2016 (Public Law 114–196; 130 Stat. 691) is amended— 7 (1) by striking subsection (a) and inserting the 8 following: 9 "(a) IN GENERAL.—All expenditures of the Commis-10 sion shall be made from donations, earned income, and 11 any funds made available to carry out this Act under sub-12 section (g)."; (2) in subsection (d), by striking "Once each 13 14 vear during the period beginning on the date of enactment of this Act" and inserting "Annually during 15 16 the period beginning 1 year after the Commission 17 submits the report to the President under section 18 5(c)(1)"; and 19 (3) by adding at the end the following: 20 "(e) Intellectual Property Protections.—The 21 Commission shall have the sole power to authorize, license, 22 and, as applicable, derive income from, the usage of offi-23 cial marks, imprimaturs, products, and logos of the Commission and the official United States Semiguincentennial 25 activities sponsored or cosponsored by the Commission.

### "(f) Enforcement.—

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"(1) IN GENERAL.—Subject to paragraph (2), except as authorized under rules and regulations officially issued by the Commission, any person who knowingly manufactures, reproduces, or uses any logo, symbol, or mark originated under authority of, and certified by, in accordance with paragraph (2), the Commission or the secretariat of the Commission described in subsection (b) for use in connection with the commemoration of the United States Semiquincentennial, or any facsimile of the logo, symbol, or mark, or holds out to the public objects in a manner to suggest any logo, symbol, or mark not officially authorized by the Commission or the secretariat of the Commission, shall be fined not more than \$1,000 for each unauthorized use, imprisoned for not more than 1 year, or both.

"(2) APPLICABILITY DATE.—The requirements of paragraph (1) shall apply beginning on the date of publication in the Federal Register of notice of certification by the Commission or secretariat of the Commission with respect to a logo, symbol, or mark.

- 1 "(g) Authorization of Appropriations.—There
- 2 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are nec-

3 essary to carry out this Act.".

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
