Mr. ESPAILLAT (for himself and Mr. RASKIN) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

- To authorize a national memorial to commemorate those whose lives were lost to COVID-19 and those who helped the country to recover, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "COVID–19 National

5 Memorial Act".

6 SEC. 2. MEMORIAL.

7 There is established a memorial located at a des-8 ignated location in the Bronx, New York, to honor the9 lives lost and the heroes who helped.

1 SEC. 3. ADVISORY COMMISSION.

2 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established a com3 mission to be known as the "COVID–19 National Memo4 rial Commission" (hereafter in this Act referred to as the
5 "Commission").

6 (b) MEMBERSHIP.—The Commission shall consist of
7 15 members, including the Director of the National Park
8 Service, or the Director's designee, and 14 members ap9 pointed by the Secretary.

10 (c) TERM.—The term of the members of the Commis-11 sion shall be for the life of the Commission.

12 (d) CHAIR.—The members of the Commission shall13 select the Chair of the Commission.

14 (e) VACANCIES.—Any vacancy in the Commission shall not affect its powers if a quorum is present, but shall 15 be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. 16 (f) MEETINGS.—The Commission shall meet at the 17 18 call of the Chairperson or a majority of the members, but 19 not less often than quarterly. Notice of the Commission 20 meetings and agendas for the meetings shall be published in local newspapers in the vicinity of Somerset County and 21 22 in the Federal Register. Meetings of the Commission shall be subject to section 552b of title 5, United States Code 23 24 (relating to open meetings).

(g) QUORUM.—A majority of the members serving on
 the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the trans action of any business.

4 (h) NO COMPENSATION.—Members of the Commis5 sion shall serve without compensation, but may be reim6 bursed for expenses incurred in carrying out the duties
7 of the Commission.

8 (i) DUTIES.—The duties of the Commission shall be9 to—

(1) not later than 3 years after the date of the
enactment of this Act, submit to the Secretary and
Congress a report containing recommendations for
the planning, design, construction, and long-term
management of a permanent memorial;

15 (2) advise the Secretary on the boundaries of16 the memorial site;

17 (3) advise the Secretary in the development of18 a management plan for the memorial site;

(4) consult and coordinate closely with the
State of New York, New York City, the Bronx Borough, and other interested parties; and

(5) provide significant opportunities for public
participation in the planning and design of the memorial.

25 (j) POWERS.—The Commission may—

1	(1) make such expenditures for services and
2	materials for the purpose of carrying out this Act as
3	the Commission considers advisable from funds ap-
4	propriated or received as gifts for that purpose;
5	(2) subject to approval by the Secretary, solicit
6	and accept donations of funds and gifts, personal
7	property, supplies, or services from individuals, foun-
8	dations, corporations, and other private or public en-
9	tities to be used in connection with the construction
10	or other expenses of the memorial;
11	(3) hold hearings, enter into contracts for per-
12	sonal services and otherwise;
13	(4) do such other things as are necessary to
14	carry out this Act; and
15	(5) by a vote of the majority of the Commis-
16	sion, delegate such of its duties as it determines ap-
17	propriate to employees of the National Park Service.
18	(k) TERMINATION.—The Commission shall terminate
19	upon dedication of the completed memorial.
20	SEC. 4. DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.
21	The Secretary is authorized to—
22	(1) provide assistance to the Commission, in-
23	cluding advice on collections, storage, and archives;

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1	(2) consult and assist the Commission in pro-
2	viding information, interpretation, and the conduct
3	of oral history interviews;
4	(3) provide assistance in conducting public
5	meetings and forums held by the Commission;
6	(4) provide project management assistance to
7	the Commission for planning, design, and construc-
8	tion activities;
9	(5) provide programming and design assistance
10	to the Commission for possible memorial exhibits,
11	collections, or activities;
12	(6) provide staff assistance and support to the
13	Commission;
14	(7) participate in the formulation of plans for
15	the design of the memorial, to accept funds raised
16	by the Commission for construction of the memorial,
17	and to construct the memorial;
18	(8) acquire from willing sellers the land or in-
19	terests in land for the memorial site by donation,
20	purchase with donated or appropriated funds, or ex-
21	change; and
22	(9) to administer the memorial as a unit of the
23	National Park System in accordance with this Act

- 1 and with the laws generally applicable to units of the
- 2 National Park System.
