# H.R.3670

## AN ACT

- To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to ensure access to appropriate temporary shelter, food, and water for individuals apprehended by U.S. Customs and Border Protection, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Short-Term Detention
- 3 Standards Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. ACCESS TO APPROPRIATE TEMPORARY SHELTER,
- 5 FOOD, AND WATER DURING SHORT-TERM DE-
- 6 TENTION.
- 7 Paragraph (1) of section 411(m) of the Homeland
- 8 Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 211(m)) is amended to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 "(1) Access to appropriate temporary
- 11 SHELTER, FOOD, AND WATER.—The Commissioner
- shall make every effort to ensure the provision to an
- individual apprehended by U.S. Customs and Border
- 14 Protection of appropriate temporary shelter with ac-
- cess to bathroom and shower facilities, water, appro-
- priate nutrition, hygiene, personal grooming items,
- and sanitation needs.".
- 18 SEC. 3. AUDIT AND INSPECTIONS OF DETENTION FACILI-
- 19 **TIES.**
- 20 (a) OIG AND GAO.—The Inspector General of the
- 21 Department of Homeland Security and the Comptroller
- 22 General shall carry out regular audits and inspections, in-
- 23 cluding unannounced audits and inspections, of processes
- 24 (including recordkeeping) utilized by U.S. Customs and
- 25 Border Protection to conduct intake and process individ-
- 26 uals apprehended by U.S. Customs and Border Protection.

- 1 The Inspector General and Comptroller General shall, to
- 2 the extent possible, share information and coordinate to
- 3 ensure that Congress is provided timely audit and inspec-
- 4 tion information.
- 5 (b) Congressional Access.—The Commissioner of
- 6 U.S. Customs and Border Protection may not—
- 7 (1) prevent a Member of Congress or an em-
- 8 ployee of the United States House of Representa-
- 9 tives or the United States Senate designated by such
- a Member for the purposes of this section from en-
- tering, for the purpose of conducting oversight, any
- such facility; and
- 13 (2) make any temporary modification at any
- such facility that in any way alters what is observed
- by a visiting member of Congress or such designated
- employee, compared to what would be observed in
- the absence of such modification.
- 18 (c) Photographs.—The Inspector General of the
- 19 Department of Homeland Security, Comptroller General,
- 20 a Member of Congress, or an employee of the United
- 21 States House of Representatives or United States Senate
- 22 shall be authorized to take photographs or video or audio
- 23 recordings of conditions in a facility but may not publish

- 1 photographs or video or audio recordings with personally
- ${\bf 2} \ \ {\bf identifiable\ information\ without\ permission.}$
