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**A BILL**

To amend sections 4501.21, 4503.571, and 4503.68	1
and to enact sections 4503.506, 4503.557,	2
4503.714, 4503.725, 4503.767, 4503.881,	3
4503.893, 4503.942, and 4503.956 of the Revised	4
Code to create multiple nonstandard license	5
plates.	6

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:**

<b>Section 1.</b> That sections 4501.21, 4503.571, and 4503.68 be	7
amended and sections 4503.506, 4503.557, 4503.714, 4503.725,	8
4503.767, 4503.881, 4503.893, 4503.942, and 4503.956 of the	9
Revised Code be enacted to read as follows:	10

<b>Sec. 4501.21.</b> (A) There is hereby created in the state	11
treasury the license plate contribution fund. The fund shall	12
consist of all contributions paid by motor vehicle registrants	13
and collected by the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to	14

sections 4503.491, 4503.492, 4503.493, 4503.494, 4503.495, 15  
4503.496, 4503.497, 4503.498, 4503.499, 4503.4910, 4503.4911, 16

(B) The registrar shall pay the contributions the 35  
registrar collects in the fund as follows: 36

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 37  
pursuant to section 4503.491 of the Revised Code to the breast 38  
cancer fund of Ohio, which shall use that money only to pay for 39  
programs that provide assistance and education to Ohio breast 40  
cancer patients and that improve access for such patients to 41  
quality health care and clinical trials and shall not use any of 42  
the money for abortion information, counseling, services, or 43  
other abortion-related activities. 44

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.492 of the Revised Code to the organization cancer support community central Ohio, which shall deposit the money into the Sheryl L. Kraner Fund of that organization. Cancer support community central Ohio shall expend the money it receives pursuant to this division only in the same manner and for the same purposes as that organization expends other money in that fund.

The registrar shall pay the contributions received pursuant to section 4503.493 of the Revised Code to the autism society of Ohio, which shall use the contributions for programs and autism awareness efforts throughout the state.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.494 of the Revised Code to the national multiple sclerosis society for distribution in equal amounts to the northwestern Ohio, Ohio buckeye, and Ohio valley chapters of the national multiple sclerosis society. These chapters shall use the money they receive under this section to assist in paying the expenses they incur in providing services directly to their clients.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.495 of the Revised Code to the national pancreatic cancer foundation, which shall use the money it receives under this section to assist those who suffer with pancreatic cancer and their families.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.496 of the Revised Code to the Ohio sickle cell and health association, which shall use the contributions to help support educational, clinical, and social support services for adults who have sickle cell disease.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.497 of the Revised Code to the St. Baldrick's foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.498 of the Revised Code to special olympics Ohio, inc., which shall use the contributions for its programs, charitable efforts, and other activities.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.499 of the Revised Code to the children's glioma cancer foundation, which shall use the contributions for its research and other programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4910 of the Revised Code to the KylerStrong foundation, which shall use the contributions to raise awareness of brain cancer caused by diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma and to fund research for the cure of such cancer.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.4911 of the Revised Code to the research institution for childhood cancer at nationwide children's hospital, which shall use the contributions to fund research for the cure of childhood cancers.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.50 of the Revised Code to the future farmers of America foundation, which shall deposit the contributions into its general account to be used for educational and scholarship purposes of the future farmers of America foundation.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar

receives pursuant to section 4503.501 of the Revised Code to the 104  
4-H youth development program of the Ohio state university 105  
extension program, which shall use those contributions to pay 106  
the expenses it incurs in conducting its educational activities. 107

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 108  
pursuant to section 4503.502 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 109  
cattlemen's foundation, which shall use those contributions for 110  
scholarships and other educational activities. 111

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 112  
pursuant to section 4503.505 of the Revised Code to the 113  
organization Ohio region phi theta kappa, which shall use those 114  
contributions for scholarships for students who are members of 115  
that organization. 116

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 117  
receives pursuant to section 4503.506 of the Revised Code to 118  
Ohio demolay, which shall use the contributions for 119  
scholarships, educational programs, and any other programs or 120  
events the organization holds or sponsors in this state. 121

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 122  
receives pursuant to section 4503.51 of the Revised Code to the 123  
university or college whose name or marking or design appears on 124  
collegiate license plates that are issued to a person under that 125  
section. A university or college that receives contributions 126  
from the fund shall deposit the contributions into its general 127  
scholarship fund. 128

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 129  
receives pursuant to section 4503.514 of the Revised Code to the 130  
university of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, for purposes of 131  
awarding grants or scholarships to residents of Ohio who attend 132

the university. The university shall not use any of the funds it 133  
receives for purposes of administering the scholarship program. 134  
The registrar shall enter into appropriate agreements with the 135  
university of Notre Dame to effectuate the distribution of such 136  
funds as provided in this section. 137

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 138  
receives pursuant to section 4503.521 of the Revised Code to the 139  
Ohio bicycle federation to assist that organization in paying 140  
for the educational programs it sponsors in support of Ohio 141  
cyclists of all ages. 142

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 143  
receives pursuant to section 4503.522 of the Revised Code to the 144  
"friends of Perry's victory and international peace memorial, 145  
incorporated," a nonprofit corporation organized under the laws 146  
of this state, to assist that organization in paying the 147  
expenses it incurs in sponsoring or holding charitable, 148  
educational, and cultural events at the monument. 149

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 150  
receives pursuant to section 4503.523 of the Revised Code to the 151  
fairport lights foundation, which shall use the money to pay for 152  
the restoration, maintenance, and preservation of the 153  
lighthouses of fairport harbor. 154

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 155  
receives pursuant to section 4503.524 of the Revised Code to the 156  
Massillon tiger football booster club, which shall use the 157  
contributions only to promote and support the football team of 158  
Washington high school of the Massillon city school district. 159

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 160  
receives pursuant to section 4503.525 of the Revised Code to the 161

United States power squadron districts seven, eleven, twenty- 162  
four, and twenty-nine in equal amounts. Each power squadron 163  
district shall use the money it receives under this section to 164  
pay for the educational boating programs each district holds or 165  
sponsors within this state. 166

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 167  
receives pursuant to section 4503.526 of the Revised Code to the 168  
Ohio district Kiwanis foundation of the Ohio district of Kiwanis 169  
international, which shall use the money it receives under this 170  
section to pay the costs of its educational and humanitarian 171  
activities. 172

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 173  
receives pursuant to section 4503.528 of the Revised Code to the 174  
Ohio children's alliance, which shall use the money it receives 175  
under this section to pay the expenses it incurs in advancing 176  
its mission of sustainably improving the provision of services 177  
to children, young adults, and families in this state. 178

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 179  
receives pursuant to section 4503.529 of the Revised Code to the 180  
Ohio nurses foundation. The foundation shall use the money it 181  
receives under this section to provide educational scholarships 182  
to assist individuals who aspire to join the nursing profession, 183  
to assist nurses in the nursing profession who seek to advance 184  
their education, and to support persons conducting nursing 185  
research concerning the evidence-based practice of nursing and 186  
the improvement of patient outcomes. 187

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 188  
receives pursuant to section 4503.531 of the Revised Code to the 189  
thank you foundation, incorporated, a nonprofit corporation 190  
organized under the laws of this state, to assist that 191

organization in paying for the charitable activities and 192  
programs it sponsors in support of United States military 193  
personnel, veterans, and their families. 194

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 195  
receives pursuant to section 4503.534 of the Revised Code to the 196  
disabled American veterans department of Ohio, to be used for 197  
programs that serve disabled American veterans and their 198  
families. 199

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 200  
receives pursuant to section 4503.55 of the Revised Code to the 201  
pro football hall of fame, which shall deposit the contributions 202  
into a special bank account that it establishes and which shall 203  
be separate and distinct from any other account the pro football 204  
hall of fame maintains, to be used exclusively for the purpose 205  
of promoting the pro football hall of fame as a travel 206  
destination. 207

The registrar shall pay the contributions that are paid to 208  
the registrar pursuant to section 4503.545 of the Revised Code 209  
to the national rifle association foundation, which shall use 210  
the money to pay the costs of the educational activities and 211  
programs the foundation holds or sponsors in this state. 212

The registrar shall pay to the Ohio pet fund the 213  
contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 214  
4503.551 of the Revised Code and any other money from any other 215  
source, including donations, gifts, and grants, that is 216  
designated by the source to be paid to the Ohio pet fund. The 217  
Ohio pet fund shall use the moneys it receives under this 218  
section to support programs for the sterilization of dogs and 219  
cats and for educational programs concerning the proper 220  
veterinary care of those animals, and for expenses of the Ohio 221



pet fund that are reasonably necessary for it to obtain and 222  
maintain its tax-exempt status and to perform its duties. 223

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 224  
receives pursuant to section 4503.552 of the Revised Code to the 225  
rock and roll hall of fame and museum, incorporated. 226

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 227  
receives pursuant to section 4503.553 of the Revised Code to the 228  
Ohio coalition for animals, incorporated, a nonprofit 229  
corporation. Except as provided in division (B) of this section, 230  
the coalition shall distribute the money to its members, and the 231  
members shall use the money only to pay for educational, 232  
charitable, and other programs of each coalition member that 233  
provide care for unwanted, abused, and neglected horses. The 234  
Ohio coalition for animals may use a portion of the money to pay 235  
for reasonable marketing costs incurred in the design and 236  
promotion of the license plate and for administrative costs 237  
incurred in the disbursement and management of funds received 238  
under this section. 239

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 240  
receives pursuant to section 4503.554 of the Revised Code to the 241  
Ohio state council of the knights of Columbus, which shall use 242  
the contributions to pay for its charitable activities and 243  
programs. 244

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 245  
receives pursuant to section 4503.555 of the Revised Code to the 246  
western reserve historical society, which shall use the 247  
contributions to fund the Crawford auto aviation museum. 248

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 249  
receives pursuant to section 4503.556 of the Revised Code to the 250

Erica J. Holloman foundation, inc., for the awareness of triple 251  
negative breast cancer. The foundation shall use the 252  
contributions for charitable and educational purposes. 253

The registrar shall pay each contribution the registrar 254  
receives pursuant to section 4503.557 of the Revised Code to the 255  
central Ohio chapter of the Ronald McDonald house charities, 256  
which shall distribute the contribution to the chapter of the 257  
Ronald McDonald house charities in whose geographic territory 258  
the person who paid the contribution resides. 259

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 260  
receives pursuant to section 4503.561 of the Revised Code to the 261  
state of Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., which shall 262  
deposit the contributions into a special bank account that it 263  
establishes. The special bank account shall be separate and 264  
distinct from any other account the state of Ohio chapter of 265  
ducks unlimited, inc., maintains and shall be used exclusively 266  
for the purpose of protecting, enhancing, restoring, and 267  
managing wetlands and conserving wildlife habitat. The state of 268  
Ohio chapter of ducks unlimited, inc., annually shall notify the 269  
registrar in writing of the name, address, and account to which 270  
such payments are to be made. 271

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 272  
receives pursuant to section 4503.562 of the Revised Code to the 273  
Mahoning river consortium, which shall use the money to pay the 274  
expenses it incurs in restoring and maintaining the Mahoning 275  
river watershed. 276

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 277  
receives pursuant to section 4503.564 of the Revised Code to 278  
Antioch college for the use of the Glen Helen ecology institute 279  
to pay expenses related to the Glen Helen nature preserve. 280

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.565 of the Revised Code to the conservancy for Cuyahoga valley national park, which shall use the money in support of the park.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.566 of the Revised Code to the Ottawa national wildlife refuge, which shall use the contributions for wildlife preservation purposes.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.567 of the Revised Code to the girls on the run of Franklin county, inc., which shall use the contributions to support the activities of the organization.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.576 of the Revised Code to the Ohio state beekeepers association, which shall use those contributions to promote beekeeping, provide educational information about beekeeping, and to support other state and local beekeeping programs.

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar receives pursuant to section 4503.577 of the Revised Code to the national aviation hall of fame, which shall use the contributions to fulfill its mission of honoring aerospace legends to inspire future leaders.

The registrar shall pay to a sports commission created pursuant to section 4503.591 of the Revised Code each contribution the registrar receives under that section that an applicant pays to obtain license plates that bear the logo of a professional sports team located in the county of that sports commission and that is participating in the license plate

program pursuant to division (E) of that section, irrespective 310  
of the county of residence of an applicant. 311

The registrar shall pay to a community charity each 312  
contribution the registrar receives under section 4503.591 of 313  
the Revised Code that an applicant pays to obtain license plates 314  
that bear the logo of a professional sports team that is 315  
participating in the license plate program pursuant to division 316  
(G) of that section. 317

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 318  
receives pursuant to section 4503.592 of the Revised Code to 319  
pollinator partnership's monarch wings across Ohio program, 320  
which shall use the contributions for the protection and 321  
preservation of the monarch butterfly and pollinator corridor in 322  
Ohio and for educational programs. 323

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 324  
receives pursuant to section 4503.594 of the Revised Code to 325  
pelotonia, which shall use the contributions for the purpose of 326  
supporting cancer research. 327

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 328  
receives pursuant to section 4503.595 of the Revised Code to the 329  
Stan Hywet hall and gardens. 330

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 331  
receives pursuant to section 4503.67 of the Revised Code to the 332  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 333  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 334  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 335

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 336  
receives pursuant to section 4503.68 of the Revised Code to the 337  
~~great river council of the girl scouts of the United States of~~ 338

~~America~~ Ohio's heartland. The ~~council-girl scouts of Ohio's~~ 339  
heartland shall distribute all contributions in an equitable 340  
manner throughout the state to regional councils of the girl 341  
scouts. 342

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 343  
receives pursuant to section 4503.69 of the Revised Code to the 344  
Dan Beard council of the boy scouts of America. The council 345  
shall distribute all contributions in an equitable manner 346  
throughout the state to regional councils of the boy scouts. 347

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 348  
receives pursuant to section 4503.701 of the Revised Code to the 349  
Prince Hall grand lodge of free and accepted masons of Ohio, 350  
which shall use the contributions for scholarship purposes. 351

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 352  
receives pursuant to section 4503.702 of the Revised Code to the 353  
Ohio Association of the Improved Benevolent and Protective Order 354  
of the Elks of the World, which shall use the funds for 355  
charitable purposes. 356

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 357  
receives pursuant to section 4503.71 of the Revised Code to the 358  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 359  
deposit the fees into its general account to be used for 360  
purposes of the fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated. 361

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 362  
receives pursuant to section 4503.711 of the Revised Code to the 363  
fraternal order of police of Ohio, incorporated, which shall 364  
deposit the contributions into an account that it creates to be 365  
used for the purpose of advancing and protecting the law 366  
enforcement profession, promoting improved law enforcement 367

methods, and teaching respect for law and order. 368

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 369  
pursuant to section 4503.712 of the Revised Code to Ohio 370  
concerns of police survivors, which shall use those 371  
contributions to provide whatever assistance may be appropriate 372  
to the families of Ohio law enforcement officers who are killed 373  
in the line of duty. 374

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 375  
pursuant to section 4503.713 of the Revised Code to the greater 376  
Cleveland peace officers memorial society, which shall use those 377  
contributions to honor law enforcement officers who have died in 378  
the line of duty and support its charitable purposes. 379

The registrar shall pay the contributions received 380  
pursuant to section 4503.714 of the Revised Code to the Ohio 381  
association of chiefs of police. 382

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 383  
receives pursuant to section 4503.715 of the Revised Code to the 384  
fallen linemen organization, which shall use the contributions 385  
to recognize and memorialize fallen linemen and support their 386  
families. 387

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 388  
receives pursuant to section 4503.72 of the Revised Code to the 389  
organization known on March 31, 2003, as the Ohio CASA/GAL 390  
association, a private, nonprofit corporation organized under 391  
Chapter 1702. of the Revised Code. The Ohio CASA/GAL association 392  
shall use these contributions to pay the expenses it incurs in 393  
administering a program to secure the proper representation in 394  
the courts of this state of abused, neglected, and dependent 395  
children, and for the training and supervision of persons 396

participating in that program. 397

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 398  
receives pursuant to section 4503.722 of the Revised Code to the 399  
Down Syndrome Association of Central Ohio, which shall use the 400  
contributions for advocacy purposes throughout the state. 401

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 402  
receives pursuant to section 4503.725 of the Revised Code to the 403  
ALS association central & southern Ohio chapter, which shall 404  
split the contributions between that chapter and the ALS 405  
association northern Ohio chapter in accordance with any 406  
agreement between the two associations. The contributions shall 407  
be used to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, 408  
advocate for, and empower people affected by ALS to live their 409  
lives to the fullest. 410

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 411  
receives pursuant to section 4503.73 of the Revised Code to 412  
Wright B. Flyer, incorporated, which shall deposit the 413  
contributions into its general account to be used for purposes 414  
of Wright B. Flyer, incorporated. 415

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 416  
receives pursuant to section 4503.732 of the Revised Code to the 417  
Siegel Shuster society, a nonprofit organization dedicated to 418  
commemorating and celebrating the creation of Superman in 419  
Cleveland, Ohio. 420

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 421  
receives pursuant to section 4503.733 of the Revised Code to the 422  
central Ohio chapter of the juvenile diabetes research 423  
foundation, which shall distribute the contributions to the 424  
chapters of the juvenile diabetes research foundation in whose 425

geographic territory the person who paid the contribution 426  
resides. 427

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 428  
receives pursuant to section 4503.734 of the Revised Code to the 429  
Ohio highway patrol auxiliary foundation, which shall use the 430  
contributions to fulfill the foundation's mission of supporting 431  
law enforcement education and assistance. 432

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 433  
receives pursuant to section 4503.74 of the Revised Code to the 434  
Columbus zoological park association, which shall disburse the 435  
moneys to Ohio's major metropolitan zoos, as defined in section 436  
4503.74 of the Revised Code, in accordance with a written 437  
agreement entered into by the major metropolitan zoos. 438

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 439  
receives pursuant to section 4503.75 of the Revised Code to the 440  
rotary foundation, located on March 31, 2003, in Evanston, 441  
Illinois, to be placed in a fund known as the permanent fund and 442  
used to endow educational and humanitarian programs of the 443  
rotary foundation. 444

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 445  
receives pursuant to section 4503.751 of the Revised Code to the 446  
Ohio association of realtors, which shall deposit the 447  
contributions into a property disaster relief fund maintained 448  
under the Ohio realtors charitable and education foundation. 449

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 450  
receives pursuant to section 4503.752 of the Revised Code to 451  
buckeye corvettes, incorporated, which shall use the 452  
contributions to pay for its charitable activities and programs. 453

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 454



receives pursuant to section 4503.763 of the Revised Code to the 455  
Ohio history connection to be used solely to build, support, and 456  
maintain the Ohio battleflag collection within the Ohio history 457  
connection. 458

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 459  
receives pursuant to section 4503.764 of the Revised Code to the 460  
Medina county historical society, which shall use those 461  
contributions to distribute between the various historical 462  
societies and museums in Medina county. 463

The registrar shall pay the contributions the registrar 464

may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1441  
and issuance of "Zero" license plates. An application made under 1442  
this section may be combined with a request for a special 1443  
reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1444  
Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1445  
compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1446  
section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1447  
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Zero" license 1448  
plates and a validation sticker, or a validation sticker alone 1449  
when required by section 4503.191 of the Revised Code. 1450

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1451  
inscribed on the license plates, "Zero" license plates shall be 1452  
inscribed with identifying words or markings that are designed 1453  
by zero, the end of prostate cancer, incorporated, a nonprofit 1454

organization that raises awareness about prostate cancer, and 1455  
that are approved by the registrar. "Zero" license plates shall 1456  
display county identification stickers that identify the county 1457  
of registration as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised 1458  
Code. 1459

(B) "Zero" license plates and a validation sticker, or 1460  
validation sticker alone, shall be issued upon receipt of a 1461  
contribution as provided in division (C)(1) of this section and 1462  
upon payment of the regular license tax as prescribed under 1463  
section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any applicable motor 1464  
vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. of the Revised 1465  
Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by section 1466  
4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, a bureau of motor 1467  
vehicles administrative fee of ten dollars, and compliance with 1468  
all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1469  
vehicles. 1470

(C)(1) For each application for registration and 1471  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1472  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty- 1473  
five dollars. The registrar shall transmit this contribution 1474  
into the state treasury to the credit of the license plate 1475  
contribution fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised 1476  
Code. 1477

(2) The registrar shall deposit the bureau administrative 1478  
fee of ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the 1479  
bureau for additional services required in the issuing of "Zero" 1480  
license plates, into the state treasury to the credit of the 1481  
public safety - highway purposes contribution fund created in 1482  
section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1483

**Sec. 4503.956.** (A) The owner or lessee of any passenger 1484

car, noncommercial motor vehicle, recreational vehicle, or other 1485  
vehicle of a class approved by the registrar of motor vehicles 1486  
may apply to the registrar for the registration of the vehicle 1487  
and issuance of "Liberty Center Local Schools" license plates. 1488  
The application may be combined with a request for a special 1489  
reserved license plate under section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the 1490  
Revised Code. Upon receipt of the completed application and 1491  
compliance by the applicant with divisions (B) and (C) of this 1492  
section, the registrar shall issue to the applicant the 1493  
appropriate vehicle registration and a set of "Liberty Center 1494  
Local Schools" license plates and a validation sticker, or a 1495  
validation sticker alone when required by section 4503.191 of 1496  
the Revised Code. 1497

In addition to the letters and numbers ordinarily 1498  
inscribed on the license plates, "Liberty Center Local Schools" 1499  
license plates shall display an appropriate logo and words 1500  
selected by representatives of the Liberty Center local school 1501  
district that are approved by the registrar. "Liberty Center 1502  
Local Schools" license plates shall display county 1503  
identification stickers that identify the county of registration 1504  
as required under section 4503.19 of the Revised Code. 1505

(B) "Liberty Center Local Schools" license plates and a 1506  
validation sticker, or validation sticker alone, shall be issued 1507  
upon receipt of an application for registration of a motor 1508  
vehicle under this section; payment of the regular license tax 1509  
as prescribed under section 4503.04 of the Revised Code, any 1510  
applicable motor vehicle license tax levied under Chapter 4504. 1511  
of the Revised Code, any applicable additional fee prescribed by 1512  
section 4503.40 or 4503.42 of the Revised Code, an additional 1513  
administrative fee of ten dollars, and a contribution as 1514  
provided in division (C)(1) of this section; and compliance with 1515

all other applicable laws relating to the registration of motor 1516  
vehicles. 1517

(C) (1) For each application for registration and 1518  
registration renewal notice the registrar receives under this 1519  
section, the registrar shall collect a contribution of twenty- 1520  
five dollars. The registrar shall deposit this contribution into 1521  
the state treasury to the credit of the license plate 1522  
contribution fund created in section 4501.21 of the Revised 1523  
Code. 1524

(2) The registrar shall deposit the administrative fee of 1525  
ten dollars, the purpose of which is to compensate the bureau of 1526  
motor vehicles for additional services required in the issuing 1527  
of "Liberty Center Local Schools" license plates, into the state 1528  
treasury to the credit of the public safety - highway purposes 1529  
fund created in section 4501.06 of the Revised Code. 1530

**Section 2.** That existing sections 4501.21, 4503.571, and 1531  
4503.68 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed. 1532
