 (Maryland State Agency Transparency Act)

FOR the purpose of providing that the Maryland Technology Development Corporation is 5 6 subject to the Open Meetings Act; requiring certain State agencies to make publicly 7 available on their websites open meeting agendas a certain amount of time in 8 advance of each meeting or, under certain circumstances, as far in advance of the 9 meeting as practicable; requiring certain State agencies to post on their websites 10 certain meeting minutes not more than a certain number of days after the minutes 11 are approved; requiring certain State agencies to make publicly available live video 12 streaming of each portion of a certain meeting; requiring the Maryland Stadium 13 Authority, under certain circumstances, to make publicly available live audio 14 streaming of each portion of a certain meeting; altering the requirements regarding minutes of and the posting of information regarding meetings of the State Board of 15 16 Elections; making conforming and technical changes; and generally relating to open 17 meetings of State agencies.


