## **Senate Bill 82**

Introduced by: Senator Duhamel

- 1 An Act to modify provisions pertaining to poll watchers.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
  - Section 1. That § 12-18-9 be AMENDED:

12-18-9. Any person, except a candidate who is on the ballot being voted on at that polling place, may be present at any polling place for the purpose of observing the voting process. Any person may be present to observe the counting process. A candidate who is on the ballot being voted on at a polling place may only be present to cast the candidate's vote during voting hours. A number of poll watchers shall be permitted for each candidate at At a primary election, pursuant to § 12-18-8.1, a number of poll watchers must be permitted for each candidate. or political party and independent candidate at At a general or special election, pursuant to § 12-18-8.1, a number of poll watchers must be permitted for each political party and independent candidate. A number of poll watchers must be permitted for each political party and independent candidate. A number of poll watchers must be permitted from each ballot question committee for an initiated or referred measure or initiated constitutional amendment at any election in which the measure or amendment appears on the ballot, pursuant to § 12-18-8.1. Each polling place shall be arranged in a manner that permits each poll watcher to be positioned in a location where the poll watcher can plainly see and hear what is done within the polling place.

The observation areas may not be less than four feet from, nor more than six feet from, the table at which voters announce their name and address to be issued a ballot at the polling place. The observation areas must be so positioned to permit any poll watcher to plainly see and hear all public aspects of the voting process.

A violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.

## Section 2. That § 12-1-3 be AMENDED:

**12-1-3.** Terms used in this title mean:

12		ballot to be voted upon for nomination or election at any election;
13	<del>(2)</del> (3)	"Election," any election held under the laws of this state;
14	<del>(3)</del> (4)	"Election officials," state and local officials charged with the duty of conducting
15		elections and the canvass of returns;
16	<del>(4)</del> (5)	"Elector," a person qualified to register as a voter, whether or not the person is
17		registered;
18	<del>(5)</del> (6)	"Electronic pollbook," an electronic system containing both the registration list and
19		pollbook;
20	<del>(6)</del> (7)	"General election," the vote required to be taken in each voting precinct of the
21		state on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of each even-
22		numbered year;
23	<del>(7)</del> (8)	"Paid circulator," any person who receives money or anything of value for collecting
24		signatures for a petition;
25	<del>(8)</del> (9)	"Party office," an office of a political party organization as distinct from a public
26		office;

28		election," the county auditor in all cases except local elections for a municipality,
29		school district, township, or other political subdivision, in which case it is the officer
30		having the position comparable to the auditor in that unit of government if not

33		the question or candidacy being petitioned, the declaration of candidacy if required
34		and the verification of the circulator. If multiple sheets of paper are necessary to

2	separately verified by the circulator;

11	<del>(13)</del> (14)	"Pollbook" or "poll list," a list containing in numerical order the names of all	
12	pe	rsons voting at the election and type of ballot voted;

14	<u>(16) "Po</u>	oll watcher," a person appointed to observe the conduct of an election on behalf	
15	<u>of</u>	a candidate, a political party, or a ballot question committee;	
16	<del>(15)</del> (17)	"Primary" or "primary election," an election held at which candidates are	
17	nominated for public office;		
18	<del>(16)</del> (18)	"Public office," an elected position in government;	
19	<del>(17)</del> (19)	"Registration list," a list of eligible voters;	
20	<del>(18)</del> (20)	"Registered mail," does not include certified mail;	
21	<del>(19)</del> (21)	"Registration officials," the county auditor and deputies and other persons	
22	authorized to assist in registration pursuant to chapter 12-4;		
23	<del>(20)</del> (22)	"Vote center," a polling place when the precinct has been defined as the entire	
24	jur	risdiction and an electronic pollbook is utilized;	
25	<del>(21)</del> (23)	"Voter," a person duly registered to vote or one who is performing the act of

27	<del>(22)</del> (24)	"Independent (IND)" or "no party affiliation (NPA)," any currently registered
