A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 3 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to student health, so as to require local boards of education to adopt
- 3 policies authorizing students to carry and self-administer sunscreen; to provide for legislative
- 4 findings; to define a term; to provide for limited liability; to provide for related matters; to
- 5 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Part 3 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 9 relating to student health, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 10 "<u>20-2-776.5.</u>
- 11 (a) The General Assembly hereby finds and declares that many children in Georgia are
- 12 <u>exposed to excessive ultraviolet radiation because school policies prevent the use of</u>
- sunscreen at school and in school sponsored activities. This excessive exposure can lead
- 14 to skin cancer development. It is the intent of the General Assembly to ensure that parents
- 15 have the option to allow their children to use sunscreen when outdoors.
- 16 (b) As used in this Code section, the term 'sunscreen' means a product approved by the
- 17 <u>federal Food and Drug Administration for over-the-counter use for the purpose of limiting</u>
- 18 <u>ultraviolet light-induced skin damage.</u>
- 19 (c) Each local board of education shall adopt a policy authorizing a student to carry and
- 20 <u>self-administer sunscreen while:</u>
- 21 <u>(1) In school;</u>
- 22 (2) At a school sponsored activity;
- 23 (3) Under the supervision of school personnel; and
- 24 (4) In before-school or after-school care operated on school property.
- 25 (d) A local board of education may adopt a policy allowing school personnel to assist
- 26 <u>students in applying sunscreen with parental permission.</u>

- 27 (e) A local school system and its employees and agents shall incur no liability other than
- 28 for willful or wanton misconduct for any injury to a student caused by his or her use of

29 <u>sunscreen."</u>

30 **SECTION 2.**

31 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
