# A BILL

- To prohibit the Department of Justice from bringing a civil action against a State under section 9 or 10 of the Act of March 3, 1899, for certain border security measures, and for other purposes.

  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Preventing Aliens
3 Through Rivers Or Land Act" or the "PATROL Act".
4 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON CIVIL ACTION FOR CERTAIN BOR5 DER SECURITY MEASURES.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General may not 7 bring or maintain a civil action (including an action that 8 is pending on the date of enactment of this Act) under 9 section 9 or 10 of the Act of March 3, 1899 (33 U.S.C. 401; 403), against a State for any measure undertaken 10 11 by the State to build, construct, erect, or otherwise install a barrier along the international border of the State for 12 the purpose of— 13

- 14 (1) preventing aliens from entering the State in15 violation of the immigration laws; or
- 16 (2) protecting the territory of the State.

17 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

(1) ALIEN.—The term "alien" has the meaning
given such term in section 101 of the Immigration
and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101).

(2) BARRIER.—The term "barrier" means any
physical structure intended to secure the border, including a wall, fence, or floating buoy.
