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To require the Secretary of State to submit to Congress an annual report regarding instances of Arab government retribution toward citizens and residents who engage in people-to-people relations with Israelis.

Mr. BOOKER (for himself and Mr. PORTMAN) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations

A BILL

- To require the Secretary of State to submit to Congress an annual report regarding instances of Arab government retribution toward citizens and residents who engage in people-to-people relations with Israelis.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Strengthening Report-
- 5 ing of Actions Taken Against the Normalization of Rela-
- 6 tions with Israel Act of 2020".

7 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

8 Congress makes the following findings:

(1) The Arab League, an organization com prising 22 Middle Eastern and African countries
 and entities, has maintained an official boycott of
 Israeli companies and Israeli-made goods since the
 founding of Israel in 1948.

6 (2) Longstanding United States policy has en-7 couraged Arab League states to normalize their rela-8 tions with Israel and has long prioritized funding co-9 operative programs that promote normalization be-10 tween Arab League States and Israel, including the 11 Middle East Regional Cooperation program, which 12 promotes Arab-Israeli scientific cooperation.

(3) While some Arab League governments are
signaling enhanced cooperation with the state of
Israel on the government-to-government level, most
continue to persecute their own citizens who establish people-to-people relations with Israelis in nongovernmental fora, through a combination of judicial
and extrajudicial retribution.

20 (4) Some Arab League states maintain draco21 nian anti-normalization laws that punish their citi22 zens for people-to-people relations with Israelis, with
23 punishments, including imprisonment, revocation of
24 citizenship, and execution. Extrajudicial punish25 ments by these and other Arab states include sum-

mary imprisonment, accusations of "treason" in gov ernment-controlled media, and professional black listing.

4 (5) Anti-normalization laws, together with the
5 other forms of retribution, effectively condemn these
6 societies to mutual estrangement and, by extension,
7 reduce the possibility of conciliation and com8 promise.

9 (6) Despite the risk of retaliatory action, a ris-10 ing tide of Arab civic actors advocate direct engage-11 ment with Israeli citizens and residents. These in-12 clude the Arab Council for Regional Integration, a 13 group of 32 public figures from 15 Arab countries 14 who oppose the boycott of Israel on the grounds that 15 the boycott has denied Arabs the benefits of partner-16 ship with Israelis, has blocked Arabs from helping to 17 bridge the Israeli-Palestinian divide, and inspired di-18 visive intra-Arab boycotts among diverse sects and 19 ethnic groups.

20 (7) On February 11, 2020, a delegation of the
21 Arab Council to the French National Assembly in
22 Paris testified to the harmful effects of "anti-nor23 malization laws", called on the Assembly to enact a
24 law instructing the relevant French authorities to
25 issue an annual report on instances of Arab govern-

ment retribution for any of their citizens or resi-1 2 dents who call for peace with Israel or engage in direct civil relations with Israeli citizens, and re-3 quested democratic legislatures to help defend the 4 5 region's civil peacemakers. 6 (8) On May 11, 2020, 85 leaders in France 7 published an endorsement of the Arab Council's pro-8 posal, calling on France and other democratic gov-9 ernments to "protect Arabs who engage in dialogue 10 with Israeli citizens" and proposing "the creation of 11 a study group in the National Assembly as well as

in the Senate whose mission would be to ensure a
legal and technical monitoring of the obstacles which
Arab proponents of dialogue with Israelis face".

(9) Arab-Israeli cooperation provides significant
symbiotic benefit to the security and economic prosperity of the region.

18 SEC. 3. ADDITIONAL REPORTING IN THE ANNUAL HUMAN
19 RIGHTS REPORT.

The Secretary of State shall include in the Country Report on Human Rights Practices submitted annually for each of 2021 through 2026 under section 116(d) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2151n(d)) the following information:

(1) The status of "anti-normalization laws" in 1 2 each country within the jurisdiction of the Bureau of 3 Near Eastern Affairs, including indigenous efforts to sharpen existing laws, enact new or additional "anti-4 5 normalization legislation", or repeal such laws. 6 (2) Instances of prosecution of citizens or resi-7 dents of Arab countries for calling for peace with 8 Israel, visiting the state of Israel, or in any way en-9 gaging Israeli citizens in any country. (3) Instances of extrajudicial retribution by 10 11 Arab governments or government-controlled institu-12 tions against citizens or residents of Arab countries 13 for any of the same actions. (4) Evidence of steps taken by Arab govern-

14 (4) Evidence of steps taken by Arab govern15 ments toward permitting or encouraging people-to16 people relations between their citizens or residents
17 and Israeli citizens.

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
