- FOR the purpose of defining "small business" and "veteran" for the purposes of certain 6 provisions of law relating to procurement from veteran-owned small business 7 enterprises; altering the definition of "veteran-owned small business enterprise"; 8 9 and generally relating to veteran-owned small business enterprises establishing the 10 Task Force on Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise Participation in Procurement; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; 11 prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but 12 authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; establishing the duties of the 13 Task Force; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and recommendations to 14 15 the Governor and General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force on Veteran-Owned 16 17 Small Business Enterprise Participation in Procurement.

12 13 14 15	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2017. June 1, 2017. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 2018, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
