8	(b) TRANSITION RULE.—An individual serving as In-

13	(1) may continue so serving until the President
14	makes an appointment under section 3(a) of such
15	Act with respect to the Federal Communications
16	Commission consistent with the amendments made
17	by subsection (a); and
18	(2) shall, while serving under paragraph (1) , re-
19	main subject to the provisions of section 8G of such
20	Act which, immediately before the date of the enact-
21	ment of this Act, applied with respect to the Inspec-
22	tor General of the Federal Communications Commis-
23	sion and suffer no reduction in pay.
