 and liabilities of any entity within the Department or any
 Federal department or agency.

2 "(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary, through the Assistant Secretary for the Countering Weapons of Mass 3 Destruction Office, shall establish the 'Securing the Cities' 4 5 ('STC') program to enhance the ability of the United States to detect and prevent terrorist attacks and other high con-6 7 sequence events utilizing nuclear or other radiological mate-8 rials that pose a high risk to homeland security in high-9 risk urban areas. Through the STC program the Secretary 10 shall—

"(1) assist State, local, tribal, and territorial
governments in designing and implementing, or enhancing existing, architectures for coordinated and
integrated detection and interdiction of nuclear or
other radiological materials that are out of regulatory
control;

21 "(3) provide resources to enhance detection, anal22 ysis, communication, and coordination to better inte23 grate into Federal operations State, local, tribal, and

25 "(4) facilitate alarm adjudication and provide
26 subject matter expertise and technical assistance on
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1	concepts of operations, training, exercises, and alarm
2	response protocols;
3	"(5) communicate with, and promote sharing of
4	information about the presence or detection of nuclear
5	or other radiological materials among appropriate
6	Federal, State, local, tribal, and territorial govern-
7	ments, in a manner that ensures transparency with
8	the jurisdictions served by such program;
9	"(6) provide augmenting resources, as appro-
10	priate, to enable State, local, tribal, and territorial
11	governments to sustain and refresh their capabilities
12	developed under the STC program; and
13	"(7) provide any other assistance the Secretary
14	determines appropriate.
15	"(b) Designation of Jurisdictions.—In carrying
16	out the STC program under subsection (a), the Secretary
17	shall designate jurisdictions from among high-risk urban
18	areas under section 2003, and other cities and regions, as
19	appropriate.
20	"(c) Congressional Notification.—The Secretary
21	shall notify the Committee on Homeland Security and the

22 Committee on Appropriations of the House of Representa-23 tives and the Committee on Homeland Security and Gov-

14	(2) CONSTRUCTION.—Sections 1923 through

17	cover the chemical and biological responsibilities of

20	(3) AUTHORITY.—The authority of the Director

24 and other man-made disasters, including—

4	cy, the Assistant Secretary, and other Department of-
5	ficials;
6	"(2) providing operational medical support to
7	all components of the Department;
8	"(3) as appropriate, providing medical liaisons
9	to the components of the Department, on a reimburs-
10	able basis, to provide subject matter expertise on oper-
11	ational medical issues;
12	"(4) coordinating with Federal, State, local, and
13	tribal governments, the medical community, and oth-
14	ers within and outside the Department, including the
15	Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the De-
16	partment of Health and Human Services, with re-
17	spect to medical and public health matters; and
18	"(5) performing such other duties relating to
19	such responsibilities as the Secretary may require.".
20	(3) Clerical Amendment.—The table of con-

8 as appropriate.

10 Management, in coordination with the Chief Medical Offi11 cer, shall—

12 "(1) provide oversight and coordinate the med13 ical and health activities of the Department for the
14 human and animal personnel of the Department;

"(2) establish medical, health, veterinary, and
occupational health exposure policy, guidance, strategies, and initiatives for the human and animal personnel of the Department;

"(3) as deemed appropriate by the Under Secretary, provide medical liaisons to the components of
the Department, on a reimbursable basis, to provide
subject matter expertise on occupational medical and
public health issues;

25 Department on agreements regarding the detail of

1	Commissioned Corps officers of the Public Health

20	existence on the day before the date of the
21	enactment of this Act, except for the func-

23	sets of such office necessary to perform the
24	functions specified in section 710 of the
25	Homeland Security Act of 2002 (relating to

1	workforce health and medical support), as
2	added by this Act; and
3	(B) to the Directorate of Management of the
4	Department of Homeland Security all functions,
5	personnel, budget authority, and assets of the Of-
6	fice of Health Affairs, as in existence on the day
7	before the date of the enactment of this Act, that
8	are necessary to perform the functions of such
9	section 710.
10	(2) Abolishment.—Upon completion of all

8	ities and capabilities across the Department of Home-

9 *land Security*;

10 (4) a discussion of any resulting cost savings
11 and efficiencies gained through activities described in
12 paragraphs (1) and (2);

(5) information on how the Assistant Secretary
for the Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Office is coordinating with the Under Secretary of
Science and Technology of the Department of Homeland Security on research and development activities;
and

(6) recommendations for any necessary statutory
changes, or, if no statutory changes are necessary, an
explanation of why no statutory or organizational
changes are necessary.
