	Section 1. Section 35A-3-703 is enacted to read:	
	35A-3-703. Continuation of high school education.	
	(1) As used in this section, "local education agency" means a school district or charter	
sch	nool.	
	(2) Subject to appropriations from the Legislature, the department may partner with	
one	e or more local education agencies to provide an education program to assist refugees in:	
	(a) obtaining a high school diploma or its equivalent; and	
	(b) career pathway planning.	
	(3) The education program may only assist refugees who:	
	(a) have not obtained a high school diploma or its equivalent;	
	(b) are no longer eligible for traditional high school; and	
	(c) are 18 years of age or older and 23 years of age or younger.	
	(4) The department shall administer and coordinate the provision of the education	
pro	gram described in this section, including determining eligibility for the program:	
	(a) with input from any office or advisory committee involved with the provision of
