BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 8-30-2, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"\$8-30-2**.**

"Every cemetery organized under the laws of in operation in this state shall have provide and maintain a full and complete schedule of all charges for burial services and burial merchandise provided by the cemetery plainly printed or typewritten, posted conspicuously, and maintained, subject to inspection and copy, shall post the schedule in a prominent area, accessible to the public, at the usual place for transacting the regular business of the cemetery, and shall provide a printed or electronic copy of the schedule upon request by any person."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
