A BILL

To permit the territories of the United States to provide
and furnish statues for placement in National Statuary Hall.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This Act may be cited as the
5 “Equality in the Halls of Congress Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. PLACEMENT OF STATUES FROM TERRITORIES IN**
7 **NATIONAL STATUARY HALL.**

8 (a) PLACEMENT OF STATUES.—Section 1814 of the
9 Revised Statutes of the United States (2 U.S.C. 2131)

1 is amended by adding at the end the following new sen-
2 tence: “For purposes of this section, the term ‘State’ in-
3 cludes American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of the
4 Northern Mariana Islands, the Commonwealth of Puerto
5 Rico, and the United States Virgin Islands.”.

6 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT RELATING TO RE-
7 PLACEMENT OF STATUES.—Section 311 of the Legislative
8 Branch Appropriations Act, 2001 (2 U.S.C. 2132) is
9 amended by adding at the end the following new sub-
10 section:

11 “(f) For purposes of this section, the term ‘State’ in-
12 cludes American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of the
13 Northern Mariana Islands, the Commonwealth of Puerto
14 Rico, and the United States Virgin Islands.”.
