Relating to health; to provide that if a specific immunization is ever required under law, exemptions from the mandatory immunization shall be provided for individuals who oppose immunization based on religious beliefs or otherwise sincerely held personal beliefs, as well as for those with certain medical conditions; to provide that during an epidemic, exemptions to mandatory immunization may be overridden in certain circumstances; to require the Board of Medical Examiners to adopt emergency rules in certain circumstances; and to repeal Section 11-47-132, Code of Alabama 1975, which authorizes municipalities to adopt and enforce ordinances to compel vaccinations in order to prevent the introduction or spread of contagious, infectious, or pestilential diseases.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) For the purposes of this section, the term "required immunization" means any mandatory or compulsory vaccination required under law for an individual who has

reached the age of majority and is not a student of a K-12 public school.

- (b) The Board of Medical Examiners shall adopt emergency rules, upon the enactment of a law that mandates a required immunization, defining medical contraindications to that immunization.
- (c) (1) If a physician licensed to practice medicine in this state certifies that the required immunization is or may be detrimental to an individual's health due to the presence of one of the contraindications adopted by the Board of Medical Examiners, the individual is not required to receive the immunization as long as the contraindication persists, except as provided in subsection (d). The board, upon request by a physician licensed to practice medicine in this state, may grant a medical exemption to a required immunization for a contraindication not included on the list adopted by the board.
- (2) Except as provided in subsection (d), if the bona fide religious beliefs or otherwise sincerely held personal beliefs of an individual are contrary to any required immunization, the individual shall be exempt from those requirements.
- (d)(1) If the Board of Medical Examiners makes a determination that an epidemic is so severe that it results in an imminent threat of loss of life, it may make a recommendation to the Governor that the exemptions in subdivision (c)(2) may no longer be permitted.

(2) If a recommendation is made pursuant to subdivision (1), the Governor shall promptly request the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives to determine whether to no longer permit exemptions to required immunizations under subdivision (c)(2). If the President Pro Tempore and the Speaker of the House sign a joint proclamation to set aside any exemptions under subdivision (c)(2), the exemptions shall no longer be permitted.

- (3) If exemptions are set aside pursuant to subdivision (2), the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives may jointly determine, at any later time, and after review of appropriate health care guidelines, that it is once again safe to permit the exemptions provided in subdivision (c)(2), the Governor, the President Pro Tempore, and the Speaker of the House shall then promptly sign a joint proclamation to reinstate the exemptions.
- (e) The Board of Medical Examiners shall adopt emergency rules under this section pursuant to the emergency rule requirements of Section 41-22-5 (b).
- Section 2. Section 11-47-132, Code of Alabama 1975, providing for a system of compulsory vaccination by cities and towns, is repealed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
