A BILL

To prohibit congressional recesses until Congress adopts a concurrent resolution on the budget that results in a balanced Federal budget by the last fiscal year covered by such resolution, and for other purposes.

- This Act may be cited as the "Do Your Job Act".

1 resentatives or the Senate to consider any resolution 2 providing for an adjournment period of more than three calendar days for the duration of that session 3 until the annual appropriation bills providing new 5 budget authority under the jurisdiction of all the 6 subcommittees of the Committees on Appropriations 7 of the House of Representatives and the Senate for 8 the fiscal year beginning on October 1 of such year 9 have been presented to the President under section 10 7 of article I of the Constitution. 11 "(h) No Congressional Recesses.—Neither the 12 Senate nor the House of Representatives may recess or stand adjourned for a period of longer than 24 hours during any calendar year unless and until Congress has 14 15 agreed to a concurrent resolution on the budget for the fiscal year beginning on October 1 of that calendar year 16 which concurrent resolution projects a balanced budget for 18 the Government by the last fiscal year covered by that con-
