

## House Resolution 38

## A RESOLUTION

1 Recognizing and honoring January 23, 2017, as Korean American Day at the state capitol;  
2 and for other purposes.

3 WHEREAS, on January 13, 1903, the arrival of 102 pioneer immigrants to the United States  
4 initiated the first chapter of Korean immigration to the United States; and

5 WHEREAS, members of the early Korean American community served with distinction in  
6 the armed forces of the United States during World War I, World War II, and the conflict in  
7 Korea; and

8 WHEREAS, in the early 1950s, thousands of Koreans, fleeing from war, poverty, and  
9 desolation, came to the United States seeking opportunities; and

10 WHEREAS, Korean Americans, like waves of immigrants to the United States before them,  
11 have taken root and thrived as a result of strong family ties, robust community support, and  
12 countless hours of hard work; and

13 WHEREAS, the contributions of Korean Americans to the United States include the  
14 invention of the first beating heart operation for coronary artery heart disease, development  
15 of the nectarine, a four-time Olympic gold medalist, and achievements in engineering,  
16 architecture, medicine, acting, singing, sculpture, and writing; and

17 WHEREAS, the population of Korean Americans in Georgia has increased 95 percent in the  
18 last decade, making them an important and integral part of communities across this state; and

19 WHEREAS, Korean Americans have designated January 23, 2017, as Korean American Day  
20 to memorialize the more than 100 year journey of Korean Americans in the United States.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that  
22 the members of this body recognize January 23, 2017, as Korean American Day at the state  
23 capitol.

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized  
25 and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the  
26 public and the press.
