A BILL

To amend the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act to improve the efficiency of summer meals.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Summer Meals Act
- 5 of 2017".
- 6 SEC. 2. SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN.
- 7 (a) Better Integrate Summer Education and
- 8 SUMMER MEALS PROGRAM.—Section 13(a)(1)(A)(i) of
- 9 the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42

- 1 U.S.C. 1761(a)(1)(A)(i) is amended by striking "50 per-
- 2 cent" each place it appears and inserting "40 percent".
- 3 (b) Reduce Red Tape for Public-Private Part-
- 4 NERSHIPS.—Section 13(a) of the Richard B. Russell Na-
- 5 tional School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1761(a)) is amended
- 6 by striking paragraph (8) and inserting the following:
- 7 "(8) Year-round meal service.—

- "(A) SEAMLESS SUMMER OPTION FOR SCHOOLS.—Except as otherwise determined by the Secretary, a service institution that is a public or private nonprofit school food authority may provide summer or school vacation food service in accordance with applicable provisions of law governing the school lunch program established under this Act or the school breakfast program established under the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C. 1771 et seq.).
- "(B) YEAR-ROUND MEAL SERVICE FOR OTHER SERVICE INSTITUTIONS.—Each service institution (other than a service institution described in subparagraph (A)), in addition to being eligible for reimbursement for meals described in subsection (b)(2) served during each day of operation during the periods described in subsection (c)(1), may be reimbursed for up to

1	1 meal and 1 snack per child served during
2	each day of operation during—
3	"(i) afterschool hours;
4	"(ii) weekends; and
5	"(iii) school holidays during the reg-
6	ular school calendar.".
7	(c) Improve Nutrition in Underserved, Hard-
8	TO-REACH AREAS.—Section 13(a) of the Richard B. Rus-
9	sell National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1761(a)) is
10	amended—
11	(1) by striking paragraphs (9) and (10) and in-
12	serting the following:
13	"(9) Improve nutrition in underserved,
14	HARD-TO-REACH AREAS.—
15	"(A) In general.—Subject to the avail-
16	ability of appropriations provided in advance in
17	an appropriations Act specifically for the pur-
18	pose of carrying out this paragraph, the Sec-
19	retary may award competitive grants to service
20	institutions selected by the Secretary to in-
21	crease participation in the program at con-
22	gregate feeding sites through—
23	"(i) innovative approaches to limited
24	transportation; and
25	"(ii) mobile meal trucks.

1	"(B) Eligibility.—To be selected to re-
2	ceive a grant under this paragraph, a service in-
3	stitution—
4	"(i) may be located in any State; and
5	"(ii) shall—
6	"(I) submit to the Secretary an
7	application at such time, in such man-
8	ner, and containing such information
9	as the Secretary may require;
10	"(II) meet criteria established by
11	the Secretary; and
12	"(III) agree to the terms and
13	conditions of the grant, as established
14	by the Secretary.
15	"(C) Priority.—In awarding grants
16	under this paragraph, the Secretary shall give
17	priority to service institutions that—
18	"(i) serve both breakfast and lunch;
19	or
20	"(ii) offer educational or enrichment
21	programs.
22	"(D) Travel reimbursement.—A serv-
23	ice institution that receives a grant under sub-
24	paragraph (A)(i) may use grant funds to pro-

1	vide reimbursement for travel to satellite con-
2	gregate feeding sites.
3	"(E) Authorization of Appropria-
4	TIONS.—There is authorized to be appropriated
5	to the Secretary to make competitive grants
6	under this paragraph \$10,000,000 for each fis-
7	cal year."; and
8	(2) by redesignating paragraphs (11) and (12)
9	as paragraphs (10) and (11), respectively.
10	(d) Third Meal.—Section 13(b)(2) of the Richard
11	B. Russell National School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C.
12	1761(b)(2)) is amended by striking "only serve lunch"
13	and all that follows through "migrant children may".

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
