## 2 Child Care Centers - Employee <u>Teacher</u> Qualifications - Requirements and <u>Application Review</u>

FOR the purpose of requiring the regulations adopted by the State Board of Education to 4 govern the licensing and operation of child care centers to include provisions that 5 6 establish certain qualifications for child care teachers and require each child care 7 center employee to complete certain training within a certain number of days after 8 the individual is hired; requiring the State Department of Education to review an 9 individual's qualifications for employment in a child care center and approve or deny 10 the application within a certain period of time probationary employment for a certain 11 individual to be a child care teacher in a certain child care center; requiring that the probationary employment qualifications allow an individual to be employed as a 12 child care teacher in a probationary period under certain circumstances; requiring a 13 child care center to terminate or reassign a certain individual to a nonteaching 14 position under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the qualifications of 15 child care center employees teachers. 16
