- 4 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON VACCINATION REQUIREMENT
- 5 FOR FEDERAL CONTRACTS.
- 6 (a) IN GENERAL.—The head of an executive agency
- 7 may not by contract, regulation regarding Federal con-
- 8 tracting, or any other action directed specifically at Fed-
- 9 eral contractors or any Federal contract (including the
- 10 termination or threatened termination of any contract) re-
- 11 quire any employee or individual under a contract or sub-
- 12 contract (at any tier) with the Federal Government to re-
- 13 ceive a vaccination against infection by the SARS-CoV-
- 14 2 virus.
- 15 (b) GAO STUDY.—Not later than 180 days after the
- 16 date of the enactment of this section, the Comptroller
- 17 General shall submit to Congress a study on the degree
- 18 to which Executive Order 14042 (related to ensuring ade-
- 19 quate COVID safety protocols for Federal contractors)
- 20 and related guidance for Federal contractors issued by the
- 21 Safer Federal Workforce Task Force did the following:
- 22 (1) Disrupted or impaired performance under
- Federal contracts or subcontracts.
- 24 (2) Disrupted or impaired the performance of
- any Federal agency mission that relies on support
- from Federal contractors or subcontractors, includ-

- 1 ing any mission carried out by the Department of 2 Defense, the Immigration and Customs Enforcement 3 Agency, the Customs and Border Protection Agency, any other component of the Department of Home-5 land Security, the Bureau of Prisons, any other 6 component of the Department of Justice, the De-7 partment of State, the Department of Veterans Af-8 fairs, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, 9 and the Department of Health and Human Services.
  - (3) Caused losses of jobs at Federal contractors or subcontractors.
    - (4) Disrupted United States supply chains.
  - (5) Reduced hiring by Federal contractors or subcontractors.
    - (6) Increased the cost of performance under Federal contracts or subcontracts.
      - (7) Disrupted or impaired the performance of Federal information technology systems supported by Federal contractors or subcontractors.
  - (8) Disrupted or impaired transportation systems or provision of transportation services by individual providers.
