WHEREAS, the City of Cochran has more than 5,000 citizens, is approximately five square miles in size, and is home to the Cochran Campus of Middle Georgia State University; and WHEREAS, the City of Cochran will celebrate its Sesquicentennial Birthday on March 19, 2019, and the city is planning a week-long historical celebration to honor the birthday of the town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE that the members of this body congratulate and honor the City of Cochran on its Sesquicentennial Birthday on March 19, 2019, and wish much bountiful prosperity to the City of Cochran throughout this year of 2019 and every year into the future.
