To require the creation and adoption of national minimum training requirements for law enforcement personnel.

## A BILL

To require the creation and adoption of national minimum training requirements for law enforcement personnel.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Police Training and
- 5 Accountability Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING REQUIREMENT AND
- 7 STANDARDS.
- 8 (a) Training Requirement.—The Civilian Com-
- 9 mission on Modern Law Enforcement Training shall es-
- 10 tablish a single national training requirement every law

enforcement officer in America should, at minimum, meet before being permitted to perform the duties of a law enforcement officer. 3 4 (b) Training Standards.—The training requirement established pursuant to this section shall be uniform and include, at minimum, standards pertaining to— 6 7 (1) a minimum level of education attainment (while not prohibiting high school graduates from 8 9 employment consideration for entry-level positions); 10 (2) a minimum number of training hours; 11 (3) use of force; 12 (4) use of lethal force; 13 (5) implicit bias; 14 (6) conflict resolution, mediation, and de-esca-15 lation practices; 16 (7) pursuit; 17 (8) video technology; 18 (9) stop and search procedures; and 19 (10) intervention programs. SEC. 3. ADOPTION OF TRAINING STANDARDS REQUIRED. 20 21 Any employer of a law enforcement officer who has not completed training satisfying the requirements of sec-23 tion 2 of this Act shall be ineligible for any Federal funds

made available by the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice

Assistance Grant Program.

### 1 SEC. 4. CIVILIAN-LAW ENFORCEMENT BILL OF RIGHTS.

- 2 The Civilian Commission on Modern Law Enforce-
- 3 ment Training established by this Act shall issue a Civil-
- 4 ian-Law Enforcement Bill of Rights describing the rights
- 5 every person has when interacting with law enforcement.
- 6 This Bill of Rights shall be adhered to by every recipient
- 7 of an Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant
- 8 Program award.

### 9 SEC. 5. DEFINITIONS.

- 10 In this Act:
- 11 (a) The term "law enforcement officer" means any
- 12 officer, agent, or employee of the Federal Government, a
- 13 State, a unit of local government, or an Indian tribe au-
- 14 thorized by law or by a government agency to engage in
- 15 or supervise the prevention, detection, or investigation of
- 16 any violation of criminal law, or authorized by law to su-
- 17 pervise sentenced criminal offenders.
- 18 (b) The term "Civilian Commission on Modern Law
- 19 Enforcement Training" means an independent commis-
- 20 sion established pursuant to this Act within the Depart-
- 21 ment of Justice that consists of persons without a history
- 22 of military or law enforcement employment. Members of
- 23 the Commission shall be equally appointed by the Speaker
- 24 of the U.S. House of Representatives and the majority
- 25 leader of the U.S. Senate.
