SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 (c) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a video lottery 21 operation licensee shall ensure that intoxicated individuals and individuals under the age 22 of 21 years are not allowed to play video lottery terminals or table games and are not

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allowed in areas of the video lottery facility where video lottery terminals or table games
 are located.

3 (2) A video lottery operation licensee may allow a video lottery employee 4 who is an adult to enter or remain in an area within the video lottery facility that is 5 designated for table game or video lottery terminal activities if the video lottery employee 6 is working.

 $\overline{7}$ (3) A VIDEO LOTTERY OPERATION LICENSEE MAY CONFISCATE **(I)** 8 THE IDENTIFICATION PROFFERED BY AN INDIVIDUAL TO GAIN ADMITTANCE TO A 9 VIDEO LOTTERY FACILITY IF THE LICENSEE DETERMINES THAT THE 10 **IDENTIFICATION IS FICTITIOUS OR FRAUDULENTLY ALTERED.**

(II) A VIDEO LOTTERY OPERATION LICENSEE MAY NOT BE HELD
 LIABLE FOR CONFISCATING, IN GOOD FAITH, AN IDENTIFICATION THAT IS LATER
 DETERMINED NOT TO BE FICTITIOUS OR FRAUDULENTLY ALTERED.

14(III) A VIDEO LOTTERY OPERATION LICENSEE SHALL RETURN A 15CONFISCATED IDENTIFICATION THAT HAS BEEN DETERMINED NOT TO BE 16 **FICTITIOUS** OR FRAUDULENTLY **ALTERED** ТО THE MOTOR VEHICLE 17ADMINISTRATION, ARMED FORCES BRANCH, OR OTHER ISSUING ORGANIZATION BY 18 THE FIRST DAY OF THE MONTH FOLLOWING THE CONFISCATION.
