LaPrade Medical Cannabis Commission jointly to $\mathbf{5}$ develop guidelines for public schools regarding the administration of medical 6 cannabis to certain students during school hours and school-sponsored after-school 7 activities; providing for the contents of the guidelines; requiring, on or before a 8 certain date, the Department and the Commission jointly to provide certain technical 9 assistance to schools for certain purposes and to develop a process to monitor implementation of certain guidelines; and generally relating to medical cannabis and 10 11 public schools.
