### A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

# State Boat Act – Removal of Abandoned or Sunken Vessels

FOR the purpose of clarifying that certain provisions of law relating to the removal and
disposal of abandoned vessels apply to sunken vessels; extending liability protections
for damage that may occur during removal, storage, or custody of an abandoned or
sunken vessel to a person that removes, preserves, or stores the abandoned or
sunken vessel on behalf of the Department of Natural Resources; authorizing the
Department to adopt certain regulations; making certain stylistic changes; and
generally relating to the removal of abandoned or sunken vessels.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
   16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
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# Article – Natural Resources

- 19 (a) In this section, "abandoned **OR SUNKEN** vessel" means any vessel that:
- 20 (1) Is left illegally or has remained without permission for more than 30 21 days on public property, including public marinas, docks, or boatyards;
- 22 (2) Has remained at the following locations for more than 90 days without 23 the consent of the owner or person in control of the property:



1 (i) A private marina or property operated by a private marina; or  $\mathbf{2}$ (ii) A private boatyard or property operated by a private boatyard; 3 Has remained at the following locations for more than 30 days without (3)the consent of the owner or person in control of the property: 4  $\mathbf{5}$ A private dock; or (i) 6 (ii) At or near waters' edge on private property: 7 (4)Has remained on private property other than the private property 8 described in items (2) and (3) of this subsection for more than 180 days without the consent 9 of the owner or person in control of the property; or 10 (5)Has been found adrift or unattended in or upon the waters of the State, 11 and is found in a condition of disrepair as to constitute a hazard or obstruction to the use 12of the waters of the State or presents a potential health or environmental hazard. 13(b) (1) The Department may seize, remove, and take into custody any abandoned **OR SUNKEN** vessel. 1415(2) For this purpose, the Department may use its own personnel, 16equipment, and facilities or use other persons, equipment, and facilities for removing, 17preserving, or storing abandoned OR SUNKEN vessels. 18 (3) The Department, OR A PERSON REMOVING, PRESERVING, OR 19STORING AN ABANDONED OR SUNKEN VESSEL ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT. 20may not be held liable for any damage to an abandoned **OR SUNKEN** vessel which may 21occur during removal, storage, or custody of the vessel. 22No later than 15 days before an abandoned OR SUNKEN vessel is (c)(1)23seized, removed, or taken into custody under subsection (b) of this section, the Department 24shall send a notice, by certified mail, return receipt requested, bearing a postmark from the 25United States Postal Service to the last known registered owner of the vessel, as shown on 26the records of the Department. 27(2)As soon as reasonably possible but not later than 15 days after the 28Department takes an abandoned OR SUNKEN vessel into custody, the Department shall 29send a notice, by certified mail, return receipt requested, bearing a postmark from the 30 United States Postal Service to the last known registered owner of the vessel and to each 31 secured party, as shown on the records of the Department. 32(d) The notices required by subsection (c) of this section shall:

1 Describe the vessel; (1) $\mathbf{2}$ Give the location where the vessel is being held; (2)3 (3)Inform the owner and secured party of a right to reclaim the vessel 4 within 3 weeks of receipt of the notice required in subsection (c)(2) of this section upon  $\mathbf{5}$ payment to the Department of any expenses incurred during removal and custody of the 6 vessel; and 7 (4) State that failure to claim the vessel will constitute: 8 (i) A waiver of all right, title, and interest in the vessel; and 9 A consent to the Department's disposition of the vessel. (ii) 10 (1) If the Department is unable to determine the last registered owner or (e) the identity of any secured party of the abandoned OR SUNKEN vessel, or if the certified 11 12mail notice required under subsection (c) of this section is returned as undeliverable, the 13Department shall give the required notice by publication in at least 1 newspaper of general 14circulation in the area where the abandoned OR SUNKEN vessel was found. 15(2) The notice by publication shall contain the information required under 16subsection (d) of this section and shall be published within 30 days of the seizure of the 17abandoned OR SUNKEN vessel, or within 15 days of the return of the certified mail notice 18 as undeliverable. 19 If the owner or secured party fails to claim the abandoned OR SUNKEN vessel (f)20within 3 weeks after the certified mail notice or after the notice by publication is given, the 21Department may sell the vessel at public auction, proceed to receive title to the vessel 22pursuant to § 8–722 of this subtitle, or otherwise dispose of the vessel. 23(g) If the abandoned **OR SUNKEN** vessel is in such a condition of disrepair that 24the Department cannot remove the vessel intact, the Department may dispose of the vessel 25in whatever manner is reasonable without providing the notice required under subsections (c) through (e) of this section. 2627(h) The Department may delegate the Department's authority to remove and 28dispose of abandoned OR SUNKEN vessels under this section to any local jurisdiction that 29consents to the delegation.

30 (I) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THIS 31 SECTION.

32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 33 October 1, 2017.
