A BILL

To address health workforce shortages and disparities high-lighted by the COVID-19 pandemic through additional funding for the National Health Service Corps and Nurse Corps.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Health Heroes 2020
- 5 Act".

1	SEC. 2. ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP
2	PROGRAM OF THE NATIONAL HEALTH SERV-
3	ICE CORPS.
4	(a) Additional Funding.—Section 10503(b) of the
5	Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (42 U.S.C.
6	254b-2(b)) is amended—
7	(1) in paragraph (1)(F), by striking "and" at
8	the end;
9	(2) in paragraph (2)(H), by striking the period
10	and inserting "; and; and
11	(3) by adding at the end the following:
12	"(3) to be transferred to the Secretary of
13	Health and Human Services—
14	"(A) $$25,000,000,000$ for fiscal year 2020 ,
15	to provide additional funding to carry out sub-
16	section (i) of section 338A of the Public Health
17	Service Act and the National Health Service
18	Corps Loan Program under section 338B of
19	such Act, of which—
20	"(i) \$15,000,000,000 shall be allo-
21	cated to the program under section 338A;
22	and
23	"(ii) \$10,000,000,000 shall be allo-
24	cated to the program under such section
25	338B∙ and

1 "(B) \$690,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2 2021 through 2026, to provide additional 3 amounts to carry out the National Health Serv-4 ice Corps Scholarship Program under section 338A of the Public Health Service Act, the Na-6 tional Health Service Corps Loan Repayment 7 Program under section 338B of such Act, and 8 the reserve service program under section 3380 9 of such Act.".

- 10 (b) CRITERIA FOR USE OF ADDITIONAL FUNDING
 11 FOR IN-DEMAND PROFESSIONALS.—Section 338A of the
 12 Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 254l) is amended
 13 by adding at the end the following:
- 14 "(i) Not less than 40 percent of the amounts made 15 available to carry out this section under 10503(b)(3)(A)(i) of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act shall 16 be allocated to scholarships under this section for eligible applicants who are members of groups that are historically 18 underrepresented in health care professions, including ra-19 cial and ethnic minorities and individuals from low-income 20 21 urban and rural communities. To carry out the requirements of this subsection, the Secretary may coordinate 23 with entities receiving funding under section 739 to identify, recruit, and select individuals to receive such scholar-

ships.".

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- 1 (c) National Health Service Corps Reserve Demonstration Project.— 3 (1) IN GENERAL.—Subpart III of part D of title III of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 5 254l et seq.) is amended by adding at the end the 6 following: 7 "SEC. 3380. NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE CORPS RESERVE 8 SERVICE DEMONSTRATION PROJECT. 9 "(a) In General.—From the amounts made available under section 10503(b)(3)(B) of the Patient Protec-10 tion and Affordable Care Act for each of fiscal years 2021 11 12 through 2024, the Secretary shall, to the extent permitted by, and consistent with, the requirements of applicable State law, use such sums as the Secretary determines nec-14 15 essary to establish, as a demonstration project, a National Health Service Corps Reserve Service (referred to in this 16 section as the 'reserve service') under which a qualified individual agrees to engage in service for a period specified 18 in a contract under this section in such reserve service 19 20 under this section.
- 21 "(b) Reserve Service Requirements.—An indi-
- 22 vidual whose obligated service under a contract under sec-
- 23 tion 338A is provided, pursuant to a contract under sub-
- 24 section (a), as reserve service, and any other participating
- 25 individual described in subparagraph (B) of subsection

- 1 (c)(2) may practice a health profession in any private ca-
- 2 pacity, subject to the following requirements:
- 3 "(1) In the event of a public health emergency
- 4 declared under section 319, a major disaster de-
- 5 clared by the President under section 401 of the
- 6 Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency
- 7 Assistance Act, or an emergency declared by the
- 8 President under section 501 of the Robert T. Staf-
- 9 ford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act
- or a national emergency declared by the President
- under the National Emergencies Act, for the dura-
- tion of such emergency or disaster, such individual
- shall be subject to serve in such capacity as the Sec-
- retary shall determine appropriate to carry out the
- purposes of this section, and in accordance with the
- 16 Secretary's plan to increase surge capacity in re-
- sponse to public health emergencies or disasters.
- 18 Such service may be furnished in coordination with
- the Corps described in section 204, a State, terri-
- torial, or local public health department, or through
- the process described in section 319(e).
- 22 "(2) Not less frequently than 2 days each
- 23 month, and for a total of not fewer than 30 days
- each year, as directed by the Secretary, such indi-
- vidual shall—

- 1 "(A) conduct trainings on public health
 2 preparedness and response activities, which may
 3 be in coordination with the State, territorial, or
 4 local health department; or
 - "(B) furnish health care services to low-income individuals in a health professional shortage area (as defined under section 332(a)), a medically underserved population (as defined under section 330(b)(3)), or a medically underserved area or area at high risk of a public health emergency as designated by the Secretary.
- "(c) QUALIFIED INDIVIDUALS.—An individual may
 be eligible to participate in the reserve service under this
 section if such individual meets one of the following criteria:
 - "(1) An individual participating in the Scholarship Program under section 338A may satisfy the obligated service requirement under such program if the individual's contract provides for such service.
 - "(2) An individual who participated in the Loan Repayment Program under section 338B and who satisfied the obligated service requirements under such program, in accordance with the individual's contract.

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1	"(3) An individual who—
2	"(A) did not participate in the Scholarship
3	Program under section 338A or the Loan Re-
4	payment Program under section 338B;
5	"(B) has a graduate degree in medicine
6	osteopathic medicine, dentistry, or another
7	health profession, or an appropriate graduate
8	degree from a program of behavioral or mental
9	health, or is certified as a nurse midwife, nurse
10	practitioner, or physician assistant;
11	"(C) holds a license issued by a State, the
12	District of Columbia, or a territory to practice
13	the applicable profession;
14	"(D) is otherwise qualified to practice, and
15	has experience practicing, in a profession—
16	"(i) described in section 338B(a)(1);
17	or
18	"(ii) another high-demand health care
19	field or specialty that the Secretary identi-
20	fies, through a process conducted every 3
21	years, as a field or specialty of national
22	priority, based on relative workforce short-
23	ages, expected workforce changes, or pro-
24	jected changes in patient needs; and

- "(E) satisfies any other eligibility or application requirements specified by the Secretary
 in order to demonstrate the individual's qualifications.
- "(d) Reserve Service Plan.—In carrying out this section, the Secretary shall establish, in coordination with the Surgeon General and State, tribal, and local health departments, an action plan for the service commitments, priority areas, coordination efforts, training requirements, and such other considerations as the Secretary determines appropriate, to ensure the complementary, additive capacity of such individuals providing reserve service.
- 13 "(e) Contracts for Certain Participating Indi-VIDUALS.—An individual described in subparagraph (B) 14 15 of subsection (c)(2) who is participating in the reserve service program under this section shall receive loan re-16 17 payments in an amount equal to 50 percent of the amount of payments that would be required with respect to a par-18 19 ticipant of the same clinical profession in the Loan Repay-20 ment Program pursuant to a contract entered into at the 21 same time under section 338B(g), in a manner similar to the manner in which payments are made under such sec-23 tion, pursuant to the terms of a contract between the Secretary and such individual. The Secretary shall establish 25 a system of contracting for purposes of this subsection

1	which shall be similar to the contract requirements and
2	terms under subsections (e), (d), and (f) of section 338B.
3	"(f) Report.—Not later than 5 years after the date
4	of enactment of this section, the Secretary shall submit
5	to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pen-
6	sions of the Senate and the Committee on Energy and
7	Commerce of the House of Representatives a report that
8	evaluates the demonstration project established under this
9	section, including—
10	"(1) the effects of such program on health care
11	access, public health emergency response capacity,
12	and the provider workforce pipeline; and
13	"(2) any other considerations as the Secretary
14	determines appropriate.".
15	(2) Conforming amendments.—
16	(A) SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.—Section
17	338A of the Public Health Service Act (42
18	U.S.C. 254l) is amended—
19	(i) in subsection $(b)(2)$, by inserting
20	", or be eligible for, or hold, an appoint-
21	ment in the reserve service under section
22	3380" before the semicolon;
23	(ii) in subsection (c)(2)(B), by insert-
24	ing "or through reserve service under an

1	agreement under section 3380" after "sec-
2	tion 338D''; and
3	(iii) in the flush text of subsection
4	(f)(1)(B)(v), by inserting ", including serv-
5	ice under the reserve service in accordance
6	with section 3380, as applicable" before
7	the semicolon at the end.
8	(B) Obligated Service.—Section 338C
9	of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.
10	254m) is amended—
11	(i) in subsection (a), by inserting "or
12	3380" after "section 338D"; and
13	(ii) in subsection (c)—
14	(I) in paragraph (1), by striking
15	", or" and inserting a semicolon;
16	(II) in paragraph (2), by striking
17	"agreement," and inserting "agree-
18	ment; or"; and
19	(III) by inserting after paragraph
20	(2) the following:
21	"(3) in the case of an individual who enters into
22	an agreement with the Secretary under section
23	3380, on the date specified in such agreement,".

SEC. 3. FUNDING FOR THE NURSE CORPS SCHOLARSHIP 2 AND LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM. 3 (a) Funding.—There are hereby appropriated, out of amounts in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, 4 5 \$5,000,000,000 for fiscal year 2020, for purposes of carrying out section 846 of the Public Health Service Act 6 (42 U.S.C. 297n), to remain available until expended, ex-8 cept that— 9 (1) of the amount appropriated under this 10 heading and made available for scholarships, not less 11 than 40 percent shall be allocated to scholarships for 12 eligible applicants who are members of groups that 13 are historically underrepresented in health care pro-14 fessions, including racial and ethnic minorities and individuals from low-income urban and rural com-15 16 munities; and 17 (2) to carry out the requirements of paragraph 18 (1), the Secretary may coordinate with entities re-19 ceiving funding under section 821 to identify, re-20 cruit, and select individuals to receive such scholar-21 ships. 22 (b) Emergency Designation.— 23 (1) IN GENERAL.—The amounts provided by 24 this section are designated as an emergency require-25 ment pursuant to section 4(g) of the Statutory Pay-

As-You-Go Act of 2010 (2 U.S.C. 933(g)).

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1	(2) Designation in Senate.—In the Senate,
2	this section is designated as an emergency require-
3	ment pursuant to section 4112(a) of H. Con. Res.
4	71 (115th Congress), the concurrent resolution on
5	the budget for fiscal year 2018.
6	SEC. 4. FLEXIBILITY FOR MEMBERS OF NATIONAL HEALTH
7	SERVICE CORPS DURING EMERGENCY PERI-
8	ODS.
9	Section 333 of the Public Health Service Act (42
10	U.S.C. 254f) is amended by adding at the end the fol-
11	lowing:
12	"(f) During any public health emergency declared by
13	the Secretary under section 319, the Secretary may, not-
14	withstanding any other provision of this section, assign
15	Corps members, with the voluntary agreement of such
16	Corps members, to provide such health services at such
17	places, and for such number of hours, as the Secretary
18	determines necessary to respond to such emergency, pro-
19	vided that the total number of hours required are the same
20	as were required of such members prior to the change of
21	assignment.".

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
