JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing a balanced budget amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-3 thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several States within seven years after the date of its submission
 for ratification:

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"ARTICLE —

4 "SECTION 1. Total outlays for any fiscal year shall
5 not exceed total receipts for that fiscal year, unless three6 fifths of the whole number of each House of Congress shall
7 provide by law for a specific excess of outlays over receipts
8 by a rollcall vote.

9 "SECTION 2. The limit on the debt of the United
10 States held by the public shall not be increased, unless
11 three-fifths of the whole number of each House shall pro12 vide by law for such an increase by a rollcall vote.

"SECTION 3. Prior to each fiscal year, the President
shall transmit to the Congress a proposed budget for the
United States Government for that fiscal year in which
total outlays do not exceed total receipts.

17 "SECTION 4. No bill to increase revenue shall become18 law unless approved by a majority of the whole number19 of each House by a rollcall vote.

20 "SECTION 5. The Congress may waive the provisions 21 of this article for any fiscal year in which a declaration 22 of war is in effect. The provisions of this article may be 23 waived for any fiscal year in which the United States is 24 engaged in military conflict which causes an imminent and 25 serious military threat to national security and is so declared by a joint resolution, adopted by a majority of the
 whole number of each House, which becomes law. Any
 such waiver must identify and be limited to the specific
 excess or increase for that fiscal year made necessary by
 the identified military conflict.

6 "SECTION 6. The Congress shall enforce and imple-7 ment this article by appropriate legislation, which may rely8 on estimates of outlays and receipts.

9 "SECTION 7. Total receipts shall include all receipts 10 of the United States Government except those derived 11 from borrowing. Total outlays shall include all outlays of 12 the United States Government except for those for repay-13 ment of debt principal.

14 "SECTION 8. This article shall take effect beginning15 with the fifth fiscal year beginning after its ratification.".

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
